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#### Spring:

Springtime saw the return of Estelle, back from maternity leave. A busy few months with Seed-funding projects meant that there was an incredible 81 Child and Youth Participation Seed funding sites and 14 CIC fora groups.

#### Strengthening Child Participation Frameworks and Action in Europe Conference Cork





The Youth led and inspired Conference was organised by the Council of Europe and Irish stakeholders. The young people wanted to 'Promote participatory democracy and youth engagement in the 21st century' the objectives of the conference were to celebrate 'the child's right to be heard and have their opinion taken seriously'.

Young people attending the conference discussed many successes like training judges on how to talk to young people or legislating for National Children's Conferences. They also highlighted areas that needed improvement.





#### Summer

Summer saw Cathal Smyth joins the team, he comes from Ballydowd special care service and brings a wealth of knowledge of participation amongst young people.

August 11th was one of the hottest days this summer. It was

also the day that five brave young souls tackled the zip wires and outdoor challenges on offer in the glen resource centre in Co. Cork. This was the first concept day held to encourage child and youth participation in the development of Barnahus South. Barnahus South will be one of three services provided nationally to work with young people and their families who have experienced sexual abuse. Input



from the young people on the day was invaluable. Discussions were had on the environment, staff, and communication methods in the service. Many of the young people expressed a desire to stay connected to the project via a soon to be established youth advisory group for Barnahus.



Young people from Tulla school in County Clare attended Tusla's first ever People Strategy launch in the Mansion House. They show cased their resilience tool called 'I-Can - Mind My Mental Health,' which is a pocket- sized tin containing individual daily mindfulness/coping strategy activity cards for young people to help develop their own self resilience. The young people said that" we were left with "the design being completely up to us". Eoin felt the project was "youth led"

The participation officers completed Gaisce's President award leader training. Gaisce are a



supporting partner in the new child and youth participation awards and achievement of a CYPA award will now be a steppingstone in achieving a

bronze Gaisce award for young people. The

participation officers wanted to learn all about Gaisce and the four challenge areas so that we could motivate encourage winners of the CYPA awards to continue and complete their Gaisce.

# The Child and Youth Participation awards!

The Child and Youth Participation Awards pilot scheme will launch in 2023. The awards are developed in conjunction



with the Children's Rights Alliance, the Ombudsman's for Children's Office, Hub na nÓg, the Department for Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth, and Gaisce the Presidents Awards.

The awards replace the Investing in Children's Awards and are based on the four quadrants of the Lundy Model (space, voice, audience, and influence). They will celebrate meaningful participation in Tusla and our partner organisations.

Keep an eye out for the next round of Child and Youth, and Parental Participation seed funding, and Fora funding for Children in Care and Aftercare groups

#### **Baby Bags**



Following on from the success of the backpack initiative, the baby bags will launch in 2023, giving essentials to any under 2's, coming into care for the first time.

A pilot of baby items has been trialled in Kildare in conjunction with feedback from foster carers.

#### Tell Us leaflet

Due to the revision of the Tell Us policy it was necessary to update the leaflets and poster and in line with the agency's participation strategy. Feedback from children and young people has been sought and developed with The Service Experience and Feedback Team, through engagement with colleagues, the SEF Team have engaged with different groups ranging in age from 5 - 20 to obtain their thoughts on the design and wording of the leaflets and poster.

All feedback has been obtained and the wording has been forwarded to NALA in an attempt at obtaining the Plain English Accreditation.
