Tusla's top priority is the protection and welfare of every child. This Wellbeing Check will provide an additional layer of assurance that children who had a child protection and welfare referral closed during COVID-19 lockdown (1st March 2020 to 28th February 2022) are safeguarded.



The Stages of the Wellbeing Check

Child engaged with Tusla after 28 February 2022:
Wellbeing Check complete



All children who had a child protection and welfare referral closed during COVID-19 lockdown will be reviewed by the Wellbeing Project

Confirm a child is in school, early years provider, training facility or known to a State or State-funded service, where they interact with a mandated person

Mandated Person

All mandated persons, such as teachers, childcare workers, doctors & nurses, youth workers, and gardaí, have a responsibility to keep children safe and to report to Tusla if they believe a child has been harmed or have reasonable grounds to be concerned about the safety and welfare of a child.
