Initiatives to Support Positive Parenting in Spain

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Positive parenting initiative (Council of Europe's Recomendation, 2006)

Positive parenting is defined as: "parental behavior based on the best interest of the child that is nurturing, empowering, nonviolent and provides recognition and guidance which involves setting of boundaries to enable the full development of the child"



Support families for positive parent-child relationships, founded on the exercise of parental responsibility to optimize the child's potential development and wellbeing.

Positive parenting: child and parent needs

Child

- Affection
- Structuring
- Stimulation and learning opportunities
- Recognition of achievements
- Empowerment
- Free of violence

• Parent

- Information, orientation and reflection on parental models
- Time for them and for the family
- Confidence in their own capacities as parents.
- Informal and formal social support to reduce parenting stress.

Key aspects of Positive Parenting initiative


- Focus on strengthening and empowerment of parents and families by improving the ecology of parenting and promoting parental competences.
- Recognition that all parents need informal and formal support to perform their parenting task, especially those living under adverse circumstances.
- Promotion of a collaborative framework in the context of families-services partnerships.
- Implementation of evidence-based parenting programs delivered through home visiting, group and online interventions to support parents in their parenting role.

Promoting a culture of prevention

- A supportive policy and legal framework,
- Scientific evidence and research
- Coordination of multiple sectors (social, education, health, justice, culture) and levels (national, regional and municipal) involved
- Training of policymakers, coordinators and practitioners
- Commitment to provide adequate resources and to sustain the system in the long term

Second objective (2012-15): To introduce evidence-based positive parenting programs at family services

- Inclusion of evidence-based approach to evaluate parenting programs (effectiveness).
- Parental support is activated as part of a universal and indicated social service network delivered through multidisciplinary teams.
- Publishing the program as a normalise (valuable) resource to support parents for non-risk and at-risk families attending together the programs.

Second objective

- Manualized programs
- Meeting the best conditions for program implementation adapted to each place.
- Providing intensive training to professionals and on-line support.
- Rigorous evaluation of the program across sites on family, professionals and service outcomes.
- Coordination and integration of the program into the network of social resources.

Conditions of implementation

- To have the program officially supported under a partnership schema and to be advertised properly
- To assure program fidelity and rigorous evaluation
- Careful group selection and previous work to motivate the families
- Training and continuity of the facilitators and full integration into the intervention team at the family services
- Practitioners work in collaboration with parents avoiding lecturing and dependency
- Transport facilities, refreshments and parallel activities for their children
- Cultural group activities offered along the programs








- Online self-administered protocol
- 25 best practices and indicators (0-4 Likert scale) fruit of the professional and researchers consensus (2 years project)
- Do not require external providers and additional funding

Examples

- BP4. To follow a proactive strategy and not only a reactive strategy in the service.
 - Indicator 1: Time is devoted to identifying the needs and strengths of families in the community
- BP16. To seek the collaboration of the whole family to achieve a consensuated intervention with the family.
 - Indicator 3: Time of the visits are adapted to guarantee the active participation of the father when it is convenient.
- BP21. The program has scientific foundations and formulates clear, excluding and susceptible objectives to be measured.
 - Indicator 4: In the design of the program, the objectives to be achieved are clearly formulated according to the needs and strengths detected.



Challenges

- Sustainability of the quality assurance process in the context of families-services partnerships to fully implement a culture of evaluation in the field of child and family services.
- Sustainability of the evidence-based parenting programs and their integration into the preventive network (social services, schools, health services, community services).
- To build on the initial merging of positive parenting initiatives into the child protection system (i.e., encourage the use of evidence-based preservation, reunification and foster care programs into the casework).
- To identify the professional competences needed to work with families under this preventive framework and to improve the training programs.
