


Tusla's Child and Youth Participation Newsletter

Child and Youth Participation Training Now Available

National Child and Youth Participation Training is informative, interactive and fun!

During this short one and a half days training you will learn about the "Lundy Model", get tips on engaging with children and young people as well as ideas on how to overcome challenges to participation. The call-back half day is a great learning opportunity as each person shares the progress of the participation plans that were put into action after the first day. Training dates are available from your local Workforce Learning and **Development Officer.**

Child and Youth Participation Seed Funding Projects

Our Seed Funding Projects are now fully under way! We are now in our second year and these projects are creating a tangible change in participatory practice. All the projects are youth led and based on the "Lundy Model" of participation.

There are over 41 projects nationwide which involve numerous partners and hundreds of children and young people. Tusla's second National Child and Youth Participation Conference "On Our Way" took place on the 6th April 2017 in Athlone. It brought together Tusla staff, partner agencies and young people to celebrate Child and Youth Participation. 360 people, including 120 young people, attended. A high energy drumming performance by Afro Eire started the day off with a mighty bang! Mr. Fred Mc Bride and Rob Johnson presented the Investing in Children Award[™] to seven successful applicants. 
