About this Report

This report provides an overview of service activity and performance across a number of key metrics for **April 2026**.

In January 2026, Tusla commenced implementation of a major reform programme aimed at improving services delivered to children, young people and their families.

Previously, Tusla was set up to work across 17 geographical areas configured into six regions. These areas differed in size and staffing levels with the result that children, young people and families, did not always have the same level of access to services, or the same level of supports available.

To address this inequity, Tusla changed its structure to work across 30 networks in six regions. Each new network was indexed using Central Statistics Office demographic data, including population size, disadvantage and deprivation. The networks are more equal in size and staffing ensuring more equal access to services for everyone, no matter where they live.

This new configuration can be viewed on the map and table in Appendix 1 of this report.

The key metrics included in this report provide a snapshot of performance and activity across the following service areas, Safety & Welfare (previously referred to as Child Protection and Welfare), Children in Care, Tusla Education Support Services (Tess) and Children's Services Regulation (CSR). National and regional breakdowns of the data are provided in the main body of the report. Network level data can be found in Appendix 3.

Explanations of the terms and abbreviations used in this report can be found in Appendix 2.

Data can change from previously published data due to ongoing validation of data. Also, data for 2026 should be interpreted with caution due to work underway to align cases to new regions/networks.

Key Messages

SAFETY AND WELFARE

Referrals

- 8,871 referrals in April 2026, bringing to 37,671 the number of referrals for the first four months of 2026.
- 9% (3,119) increase in referrals, 2026 YTD versus the same period in 2025 (34,552).

Open Cases (Safety & Welfare and Children in Care (mainstream) Combined)

- 25,097 cases open to social work (includes safety & welfare cases and children in care) at the end of April 2026; 81 (<1%) fewer than March 2026 (25,178).
- 10% (2,180) increase in open cases year on year
- 78% (19,631) of cases allocated to a case worker.
- 78% (15,293) of allocations to social workers and 22% (4,338) to other professionals.
- 5,466 (22%) cases awaiting allocation, 17 more than March 2026 (5,449).

Open Cases (Safety & Welfare Cases Only)

- 19,279 cases open to social work (safety & welfare cases only) at the end of April 2026; 77 (<1%) fewer than March 2026 (19,356).
- 12% (2,037) increase in open cases year on year.
- 72% (13,941) of cases allocated to a case worker.
- 73% (10,149) of allocations to social workers and 27% (3,792) to other professionals.
- 5,338 (28%) cases awaiting allocation, 11 more than March 2026 (5,327).

Child Protection Notification System (CPNS)

- 1,169 children 'active' on the CPNS at the end of April 2026, no change from March 2026.
- 12% (124) increase in the number 'active' year on year
- 99% (1,158) of children allocated to a social worker; 11 children awaiting allocation, nine fewer than March 2026 (20).
- 6 of the 11 children awaiting allocation were allocated to another professional worker; four of the five remaining children were subsequently allocated to a social worker.

Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure (CASP)

- 83 referrals assigned in the first four months of 2026
- 302 assessments open under CASP at the end of April 2026; 41% (212) decrease year on year

- 87% (263) of open assessments allocated to a social worker, 39 (13%) assessments awaiting allocation, 4 (11%) more than March 2026 (35).

CHILDREN IN CARE

- 5,949 children in care (includes 131 unaccompanied minors) at the end of April 2026, a 3% (168) increase year on year.
- 85.2% of all children in care (mainstream and unaccompanied minors) are in foster care; 86.9% of mainstream children in care in foster care.
- 1,175 (19.8%) children in care are in placements with private providers, 20 (2%) more than March 2026 (1,155)
- 12% (122) increase in placements with private providers year on year.
- 98% (5,818) of children in care were allocated to a case worker.
- 91% (5,272) of allocations were to social workers and 9% (546) were to other professionals.
- 131 (9%) children awaiting allocation, one fewer than March 2026 (132)
- 82% (4,889) of children in care have an up-to-date care plan.

TUSLA EDUCATION SUPPORT SERVICES

- 10,967 referrals for an educational welfare this school year to date.
- 11,457 cases open to educational welfare services, the highest number this school year to date.
- 52.5% (6,014) of cases allocated to educational welfare officers, 5,443 (47.5%) cases on a waiting list for allocation, 491 (10%) more than March 2026 (4,952).

CHILDREN'S SERVICES REGULATION

Early Years Services (Pre-Schools)

- 3,940 pre-school services on the register at the end of April 2026; 1% (33) decrease year on year.
- 906 inspections of pre-school for the first four months of 2026; 10% (79) increase year-on-year.

Home Education

- 2,662 children on the register for home education at the end of April 2026; 10% (240) increase year on year.
- 348 children awaiting assessment for registration for home education, 18 (5%) fewer than March 2026 (366).
- 15% (62) decrease in the number waiting year on year.

- **25,097 cases open** to social work at the end of April 2026; 81 (<1%) fewer than March 2026 (25,178)
- 10% (2,180) increase in open cases year on year
- **78% (19,631) of open cases allocated to a case worker**
- **5,466 (22%) cases awaiting allocation**, 17 more than March 2026 (5,449)
- 78% (15,293) of allocations are to social workers; 22% (4,338) to other professionals
- **232 (4%) cases awaiting allocation are high priority**, 64 (22%) fewer than March 2026 (296).

Regional

- **Dublin Mid Leinster - highest number of open cases**, (5,842; 23%).
- **Mid West - fewest number** (3,392; 14%).

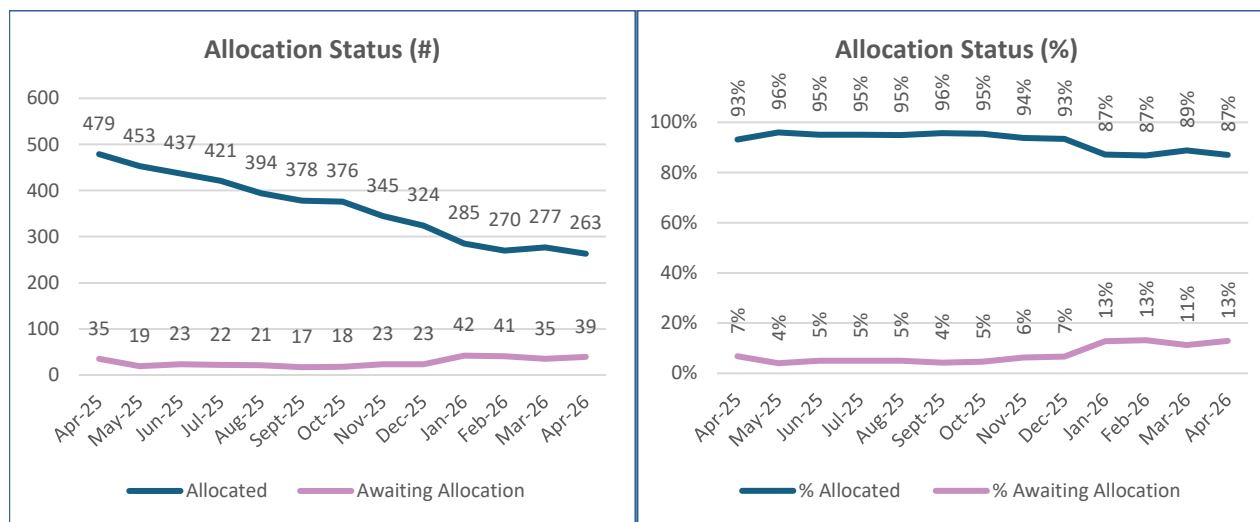

Regional

- **West North East - highest number** (106; 35%) of open assessments. **Dublin Mid Leinster - fewest number** (21; 7%).
- West North East (21) and Dublin North East (13) account for 87% (34) of assessments awaiting allocation. South West reports no assessments awaiting allocation.

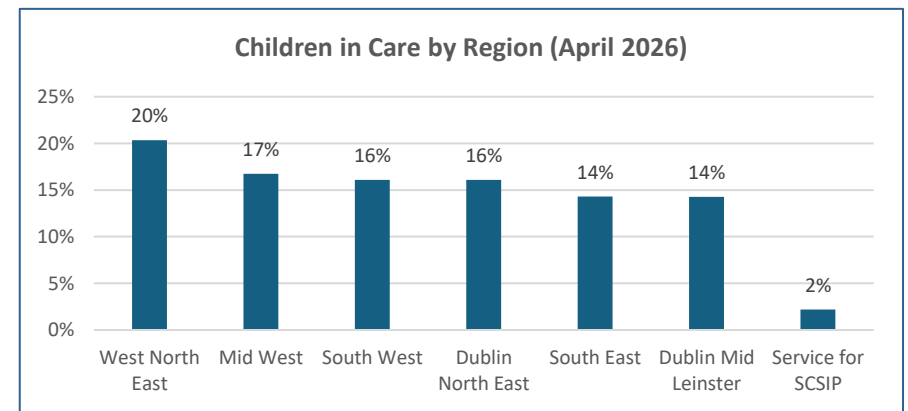
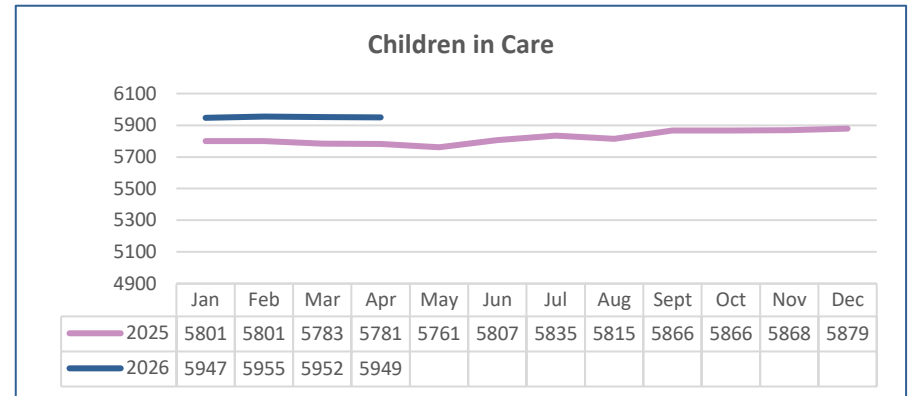
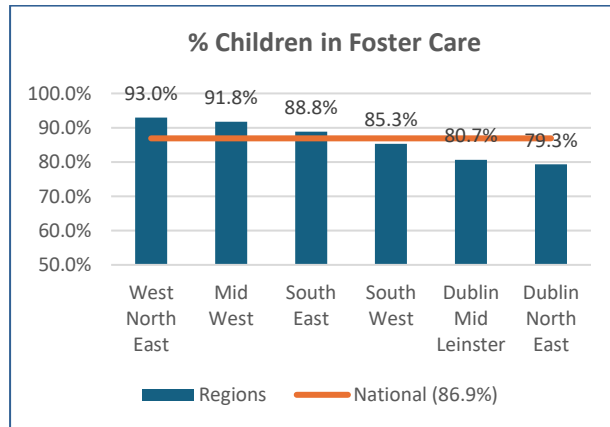

- **5,949 children in care, includes 131 unaccompanied minors.** The Service for Separated Children Seeking International Protection (SCSIP) reports an additional 387 children being accommodated / provided with services under Section 5 Child Care Act 1991.
- 3% (168) increase in children in care year on year (5,781).
- 85.2% of all children (mainstream and unaccompanied minors) in care are in foster care
- 86.9% of mainstream children in care in foster care

Regional

- **West North East - highest number of children in care** (1,211; 20%). **Dublin Mid Leinster - fewest number** (848; 14%).
- The **percentage of children in foster care** across the regions ranges from 93.0% in West North East to 79.3% in Dublin North East.

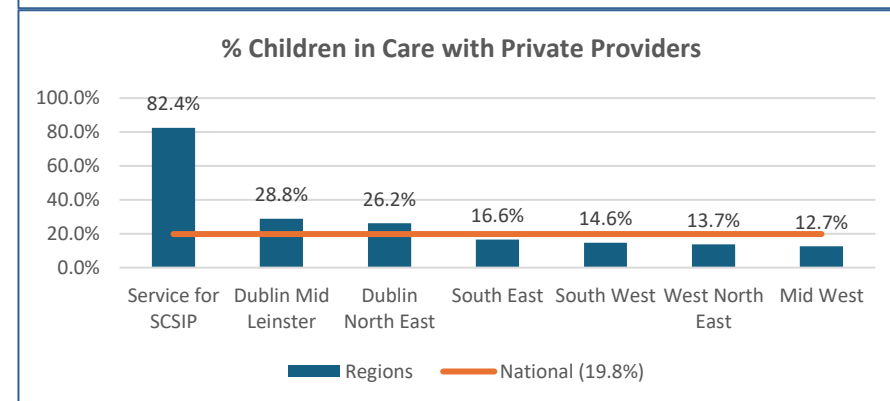
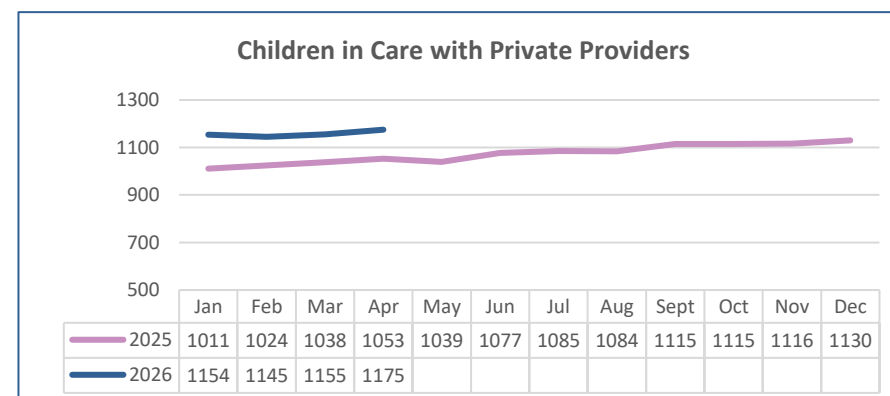
- **1,175 (19.8%) children** in care are with **private providers**, 20 (2%) more than March 2026 (1,155).
- **12% (122) increase** in the number of children with private providers year on year
- 36% (423) of children with private providers were in residential care, 54% (637) were in foster care and 10% (115) were in other care placements.

Regional

- Dublin North East (250) and Dublin Mid Leinster (244) - highest numbers of children with private providers. Mid West reports the fewest number at 126.
- The percentage of children in care with private providers across the regions ranges from 28.8% (Dublin Mid Leinster) to 12.7% (Mid West) against a national average of 19.8%.

Service for Separated Children Seeking International Protection

- The majority of unaccompanied minors in care are with private providers (82.4%; 108).

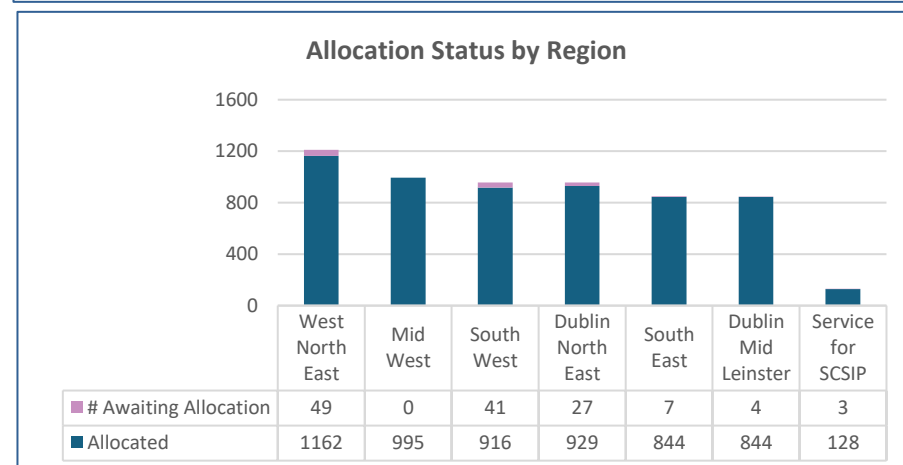
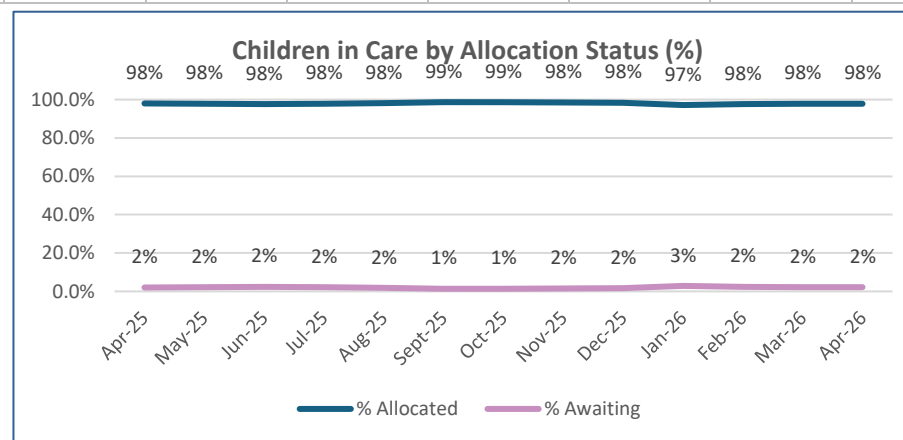

- **98% (5,818) of children in care** have an **allocated case worker**
- High rate consistently maintained
- **131 children awaiting allocation**, one fewer than March 2026 (132).
- 91% (5,272) of allocations to social workers; 9% (546) to other professionals.
- **82% (4,889) children in care** have an **up-to-date care plan**, 1,060 (18%) children awaiting, 16 (2%) more than March 2026 (1,044).

Regional

- All six regions reporting **at least 96% of children with an allocated worker**.
- West North East (49) and South West (41) account for 69% (90) of children awaiting allocation to worker.
- Three of the six regions report at least 82% of children with an up-to-date care plan. Rates reported by Dublin Mid Leinster (81%), Dublin North East (76%) and South West (78%) slightly lower than average.

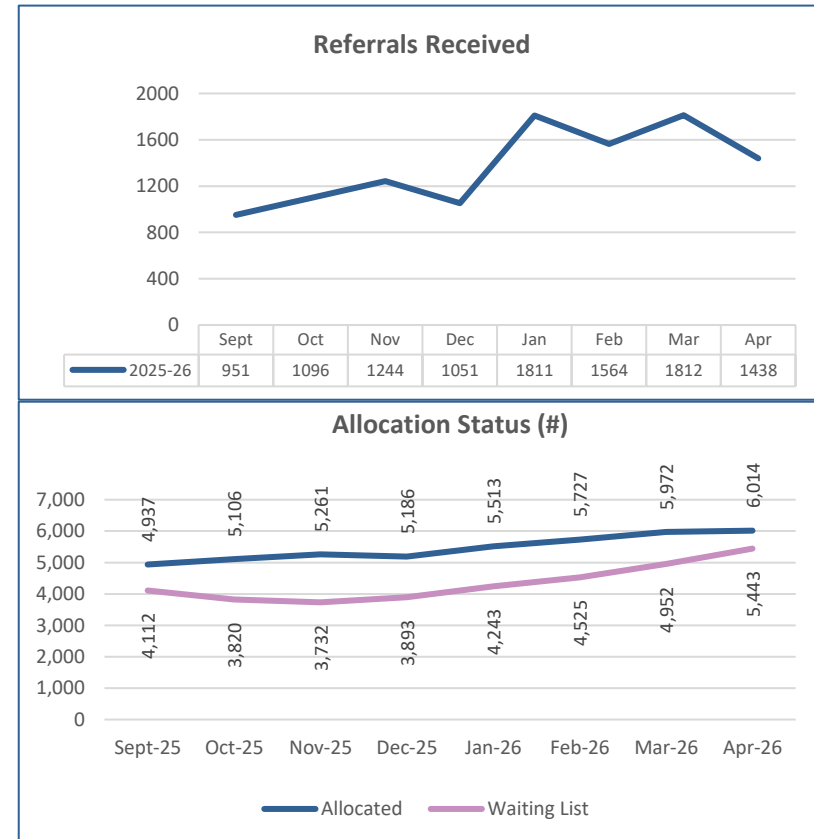

Key Messages | April 2026

- **1,438 referrals** for an education welfare service in April 2026, bringing to 10,967 the number of referrals for the school YTD
- **11,457 cases open** to educational welfare services at the end of April 2026, 533 (5%) more than March 2026 (10,924) and the highest number for all months this school YTD.
- **52.5% (6,014) of open cases were allocated**, down slightly from 54.7% (5,972) in March 2026.
- Despite the slight decrease in the percentage of cases allocated, there were 42 more cases allocated at the end of April 2026 (6,014) than at the end of March 2026 (5,972).
- **47.5% (5,443) of cases were on a waiting list for allocation**
- 491 more cases on the waiting list at the end of April 2026 (5,443) than at the end of March 2026 (4,952).
- This represents a 10% increase over the month, and it is the fifth consecutive monthly increase.

These children are the subject of a child protection plan agreed at a child protection conference. The CPNS is accessible to named professional groups subject to strict protocols. CASP	Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure It is Tusla's statutory obligation and responsibility to promote the welfare of children under Section 3 of the Child Care Act 1991 and under Section 8 (1)(b) of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013. In meeting this obligation and

	<p>responsibility, where there is a need to share information with a relevant third party to protect an identified, identifiable and or yet to be identified children, or yet to be identified child or children from harm, Tusla must carry out an assessment of allegations of child abuse in line with fair procedures. This is called a ‘substantiation assessment’ – an assessment that examines and weighs up all the evidence and decides if the allegation is founded or unfounded on the balance of probabilities. If the allegation is founded a determination is made whether that the person who is the subject of the abuse allegations poses a potential risk to a child or children. Tusla calls this process the CASP – Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure. Further information can be found on the Tusla website</p>
