About this Report

This report provides an overview of service activity and performance across a number of key metrics for **February 2026**.

In January 2026, Tusla commenced implementation of a major reform programme aimed at improving services delivered to children, young people and their families.

Previously, Tusla was set up to work across 17 geographical areas configured into six regions. These areas differed in size and staffing levels with the result that children, young people and families, did not always have the same level of access to services, or the same level of supports available.

To address this inequity, Tusla changed its structure to work across 30 networks in six regions. Each new network was indexed using Central Statistics Office demographic data, including population size, disadvantage and deprivation. The networks are more equal in size and staffing ensuring more equal access to services for everyone, no matter where they live.

This new configuration can be viewed on the map and table in Appendix 1 of this report.

The key metrics included in this report provide a snapshot of performance and activity across the following service areas, Safety & Welfare (previously referred to as Child Protection and Welfare), Children in Care, Tusla Education Support Services (Tess) and Children's Services Regulation (CSR). National and regional breakdowns of the data are provided in the main body of the report. Network level data can be found in Appendix 3.

Explanations of the terms and abbreviations used in this report can be found in Appendix 2.

Data can change from previously published data due to ongoing validation of data. Also, data for January and February 2026 should be interpreted with caution due to work underway to align cases to new regions/networks.

Key Messages

SAFETY AND WELFARE

Referrals

- 9,145 referrals in February 2026, bringing to 18,959 the number of referrals for the first two months of 2026.
- 13% (2,232) increase in referrals, 2026 YTD versus the same period in 2025 (16,727).

Open Cases (Safety & Welfare and Children in Care Combined)

- 25,035 cases open to social work (includes safety & welfare cases and children in care) at the end of February 2026; a 9% (2,080) increase year on year (22,955).
- 77% (19,376) of cases allocated to a case worker. Of these 79% were allocated to a social worker and 21% were allocated to another professional.
- 5,659 (23%) cases awaiting allocation, 628 (10%) fewer than January 2026 (6,287).

Open Cases (Safety & Welfare Cases Only)

- 19,214 cases open to social work (safety & welfare cases only) at the end of February 2026; a 11% (1,961) increase year on year (17,253).
- 71% of cases allocated to a case worker. Of these 74% were allocated to a social worker and 26% were allocated to another professional.
- 5,519 (29%) cases awaiting allocation, 607 (10%) fewer than January 2026 (6,126).

Child Protection Notification System (CPNS)

- 1,145 children 'active' on the CPNS at the end of February 2026, an 8% (84) increase year on year (1,061).
- 99.3% (1,137) of children allocated to a social worker; 8 children awaiting allocation, 8 (50%) fewer than January 2026 (16). All eight children allocated to another professional worker.

Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure (CASP)

- 311 assessments open under CASP at the end of February 2026, a 52% (342) decrease year on year (653).
- 87% (270) of assessments allocated to a social worker, 41 (13%) assessments awaiting allocation, one fewer than January 2026 (42).

CHILDREN IN CARE

- 5,955 children in care (includes 134 unaccompanied minors) at the end of February 2026, a 3% (154) increase year on year (5,801).

- 85.6% of all children in care are in foster care; 87.3% of children in care across the regions are in foster care.
- 1,145 (19.2%) children in care are in placements with private providers, a 12% (121) increase year on year (1,024).
- 98% (5,812) of children in care allocated to a case worker. Of these 92% were allocated to social worker and 8% were allocated to another professional.
- 143 children awaiting allocation, 27 (16%) fewer than January 2026 (170).
- 84% (4,994) of children in care have an up-to-date care plan.

TUSLA EDUCATION SUPPORT SERVICES

- 7,717 referrals for an educational welfare this school year to date.
- 10,252 cases open to educational welfare services, the highest number this school year to date.
- 56% (5,727) of cases allocated to an educational welfare officers, 4,525 (44%) cases on a waiting list for allocation, 282 (7%) more than January 2026 (4,243).

CHILDREN'S SERVICES REGULATION

Early Years Services (Pre-Schools)

- 3,942 early years services (pre-schools) on the register at the end of February 2026, a 1% (34) decrease year on year (3,976).

Home Education

- 2,596 children on the register for home education at the end of February 2026, a 7% (176) increase year on year (2,420).
- 348 children awaiting assessment for registration for home education, first decrease after five consecutive monthly increases.
- 36% (195) decrease in the number waiting year on year (543).

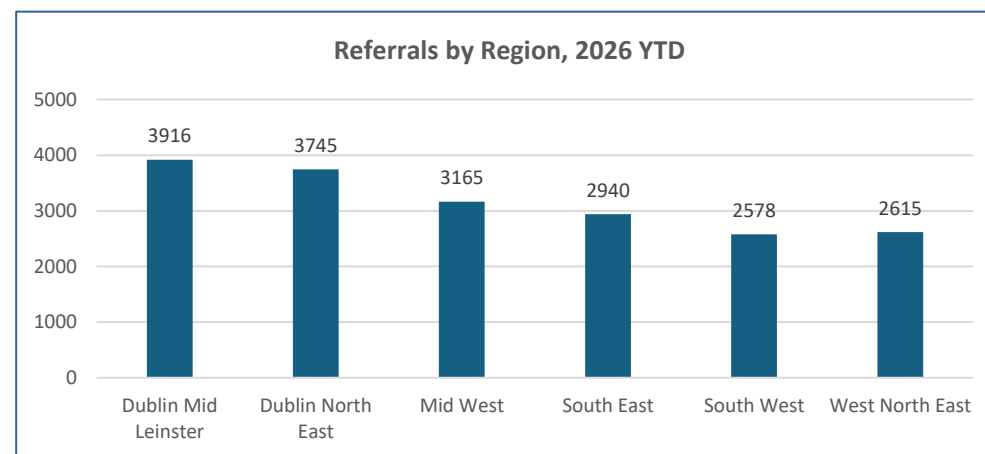
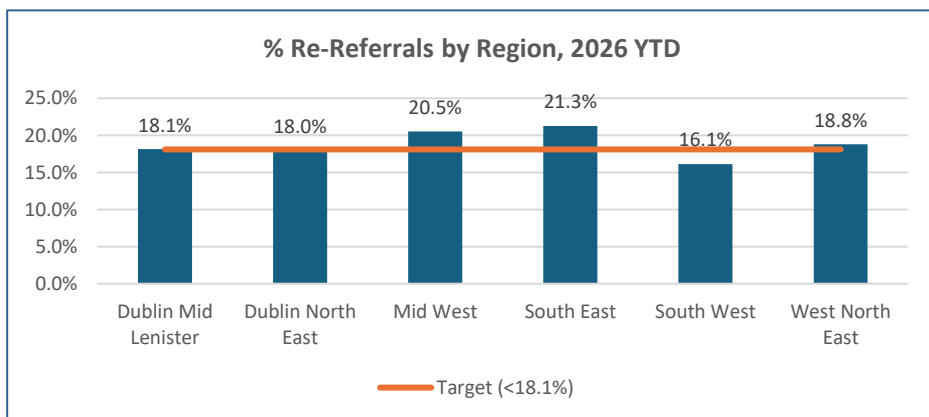
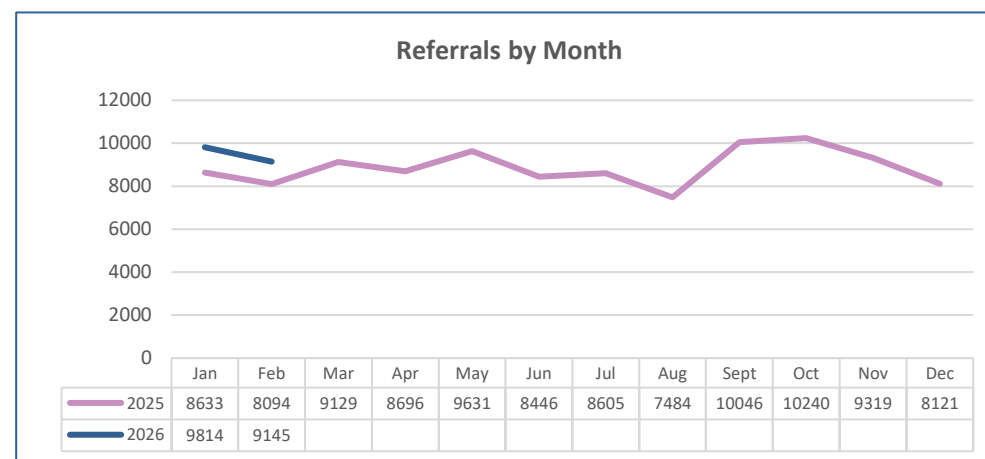

- **13% (2,232) increase in referrals**, 2026 YTD v same period in 2025 (16,727).
- **18.8% of referrals YTD were re-referrals** against a target of ≤18.1%

Regional

- Highest **number of referrals YTD** reported by Dublin Mid Leinster (3,916; 21%), fewest number reported by South West (2,578; 14%).
- Highest **rate of re-referrals** reported by South East (21.3%), lowest rate reported by South West (16.1%). Three regions (Mid West, South East and West North East) slightly above the target of ≤18.1%.

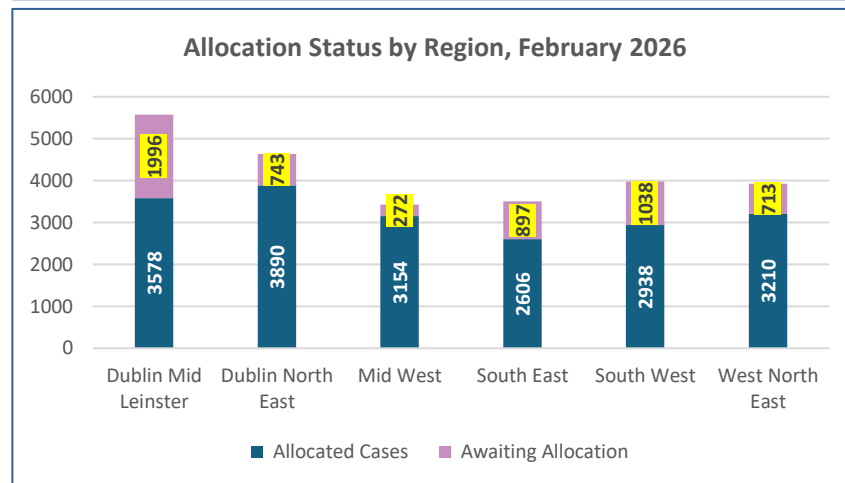
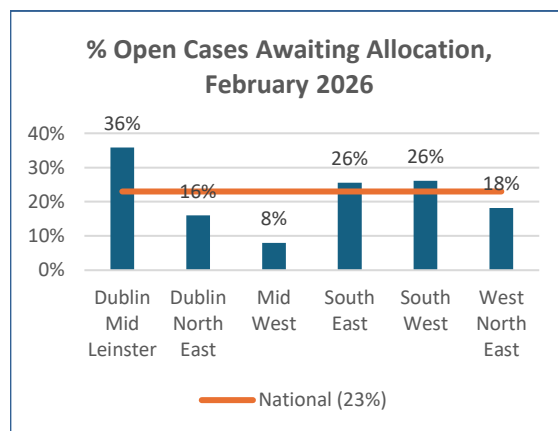
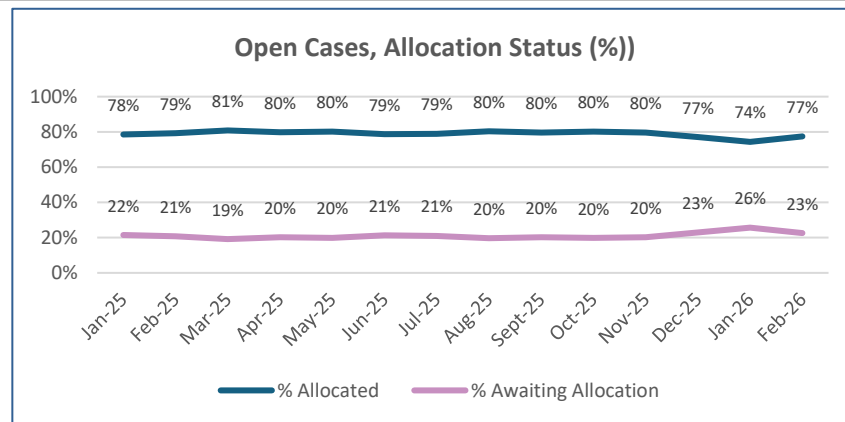

National

- **25,035 cases open** to social work at the end of Feb 2026; 9% (2,080) increase year on year
- **77% (19,376) of open cases allocated to a case worker**
- **5,659 (23%) cases awaiting allocation**, 628 (10%) fewer than Jan 2026 (6,287).
- 79% of cases allocated are allocated to a social worker; 21% allocated to another professional
- **255 (5%) cases awaiting allocation are high priority**, 36 (12%) fewer than Jan 2026 (291).

Regional

- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of open cases**, (5,574; 22%). Mid West reports the fewest number (3,426; 14%).
- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of cases awaiting allocation** (1,996; 35% of all cases awaiting), Mid West reports the fewest number (272; 5%).
- Percentage of cases awaiting allocation higher than average (23%) in three regions, Dublin Mid Leinster (36%), South East (26%) and South West (26%).

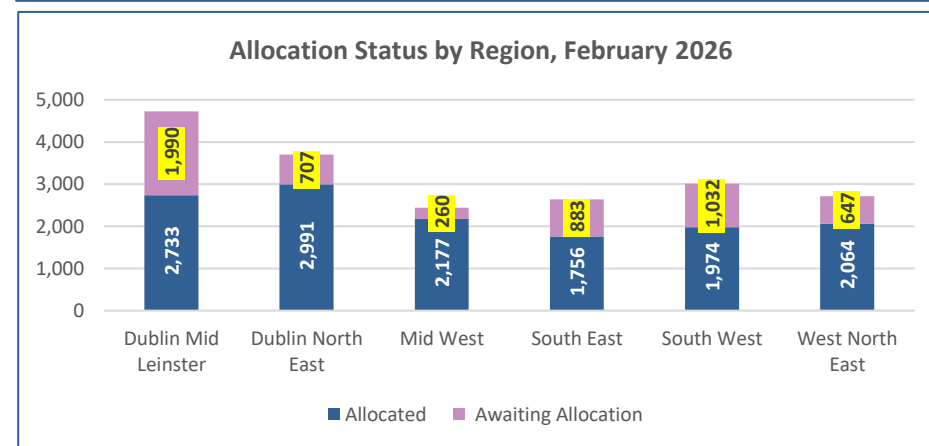
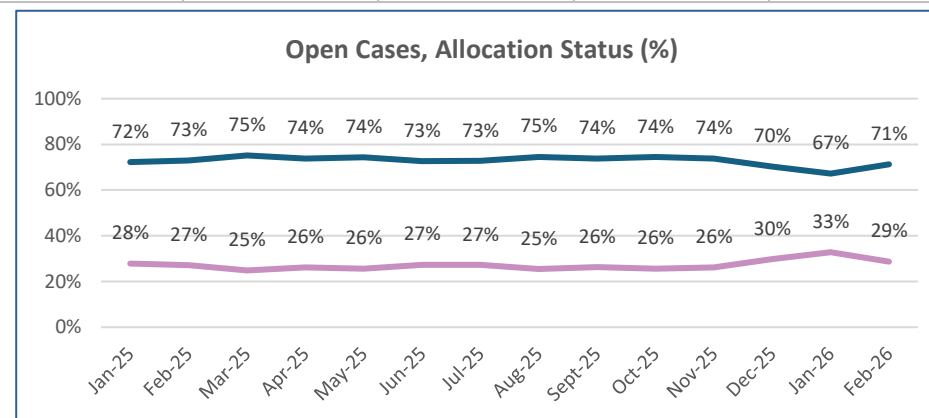
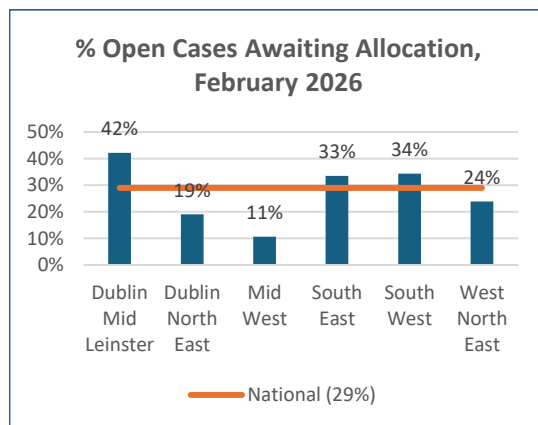

National

- **19,214 cases open** to social work at the end of Feb 2026, a 11% (1,961) increase year on year
- **71% (13,695) of open cases allocated to a case worker,**
- **5,519 (29%) cases awaiting allocation,** 607 (10%) fewer than Jan 2026 (6,126).
- 74% of cases allocated are allocated to a social worker; 26% allocated to another professional
- **4% (198) of cases awaiting allocation are high priority,** 34 (15%) fewer than Jan 2026 (232).

Regional

- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of open cases,** (4,723; 25%). Mid West reports the fewest number (2,437; 13%).
- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of cases awaiting allocation** (1,990 accounting for 36% of all cases awaiting). Mid West reports the fewest number (260; 5%).
- Percentage of cases awaiting allocation higher than average (29%) in three regions, Dublin Mid Leinster (42%), South East (33%) and South West (34%).

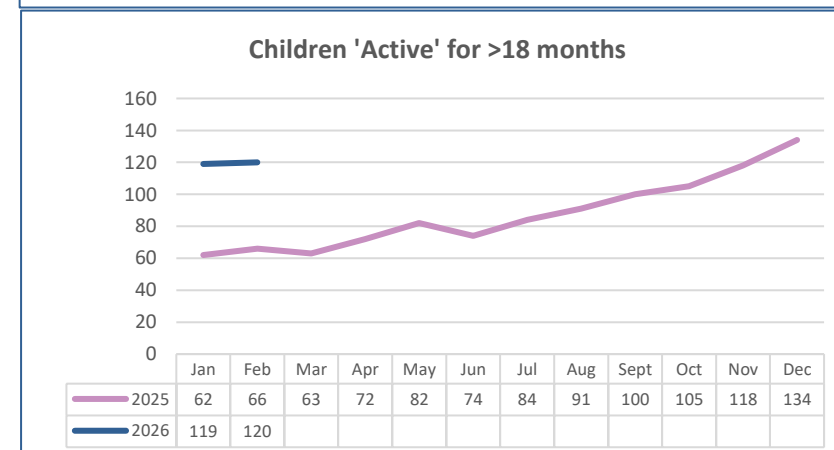
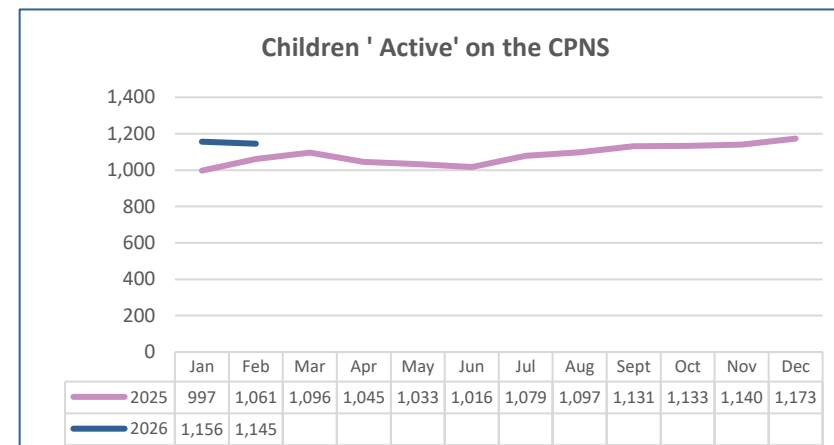
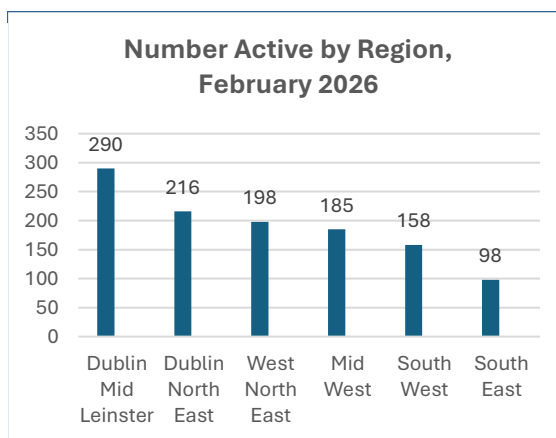

- **1,145 children 'active' on the CPNS**, 11 (1%) fewer than Jan 2026 (1,156), second consecutive monthly decrease.
- 8% (84) increase in the number of children 'active' on the CPNS year-on-year (1,061).
- **99.3% (1,137) of children allocated to a social worker**; 8 children awaiting allocation, 8 (50%) fewer than January 2026 (16).
- All of the children awaiting allocation were allocated to another professional worker.
- **120 (10%) children 'active' for more than 18 months**, one more than Jan 2026 (119) and 54 (82%) more than Feb 2025 (66).

Regional

- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number (290; 25%) of children 'active'**. South East reports the fewest number (98; 9%).
- 5 of the 8 children awaiting allocation to a social worker were reported by Dublin Mid Leinster. Three regions (Dublin North East, South East and South West) reported no children awaiting allocation.
- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of children 'active for >18 months (31)**, followed closely by Dublin North East (29). South East reports the fewest number (9).

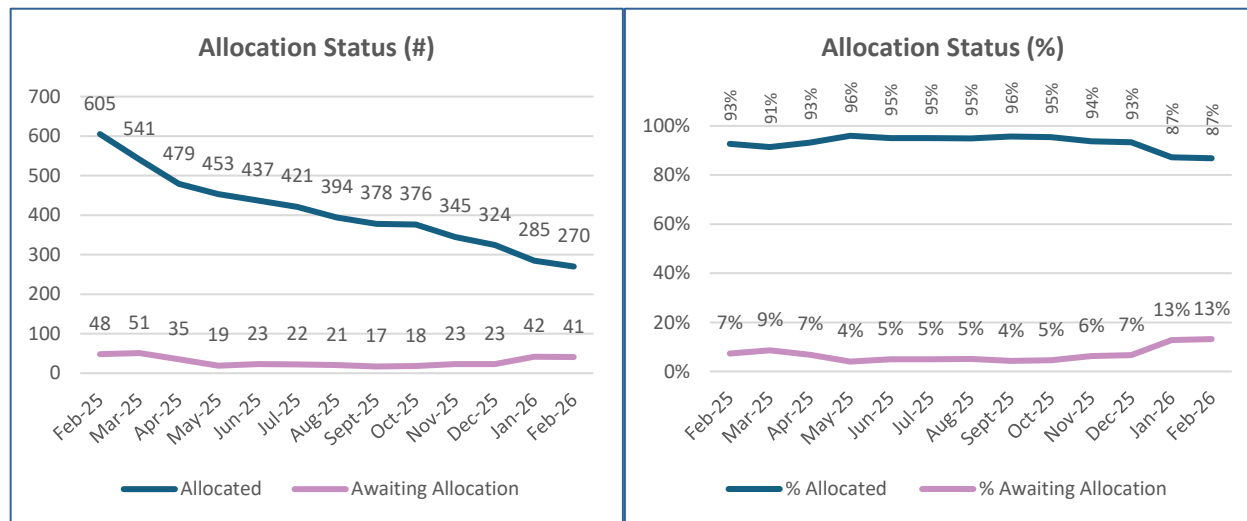

- **87% (270)** of assessments allocated to a social worker
- **41 (13%) assessments awaiting allocation**, one fewer than Jan 2026 (42).

Regional

- West North East reports the highest number (109; 35%) of open assessments. Dublin Mid Leinster reports the fewest number (21; 7%).
- West North East (16) and Dublin North East (13) account for 70% (29) of assessments awaiting allocation. South West reports no assessments awaiting allocation.

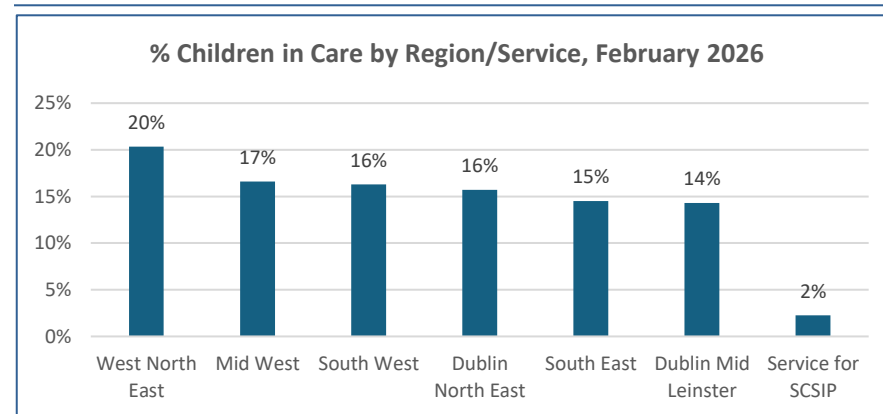
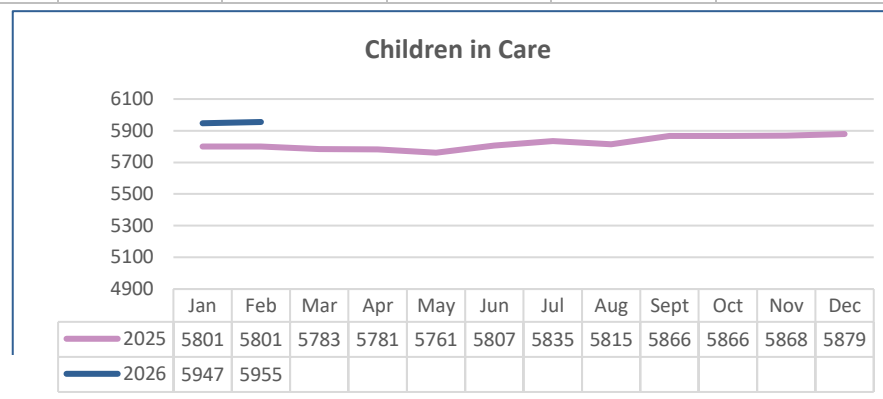
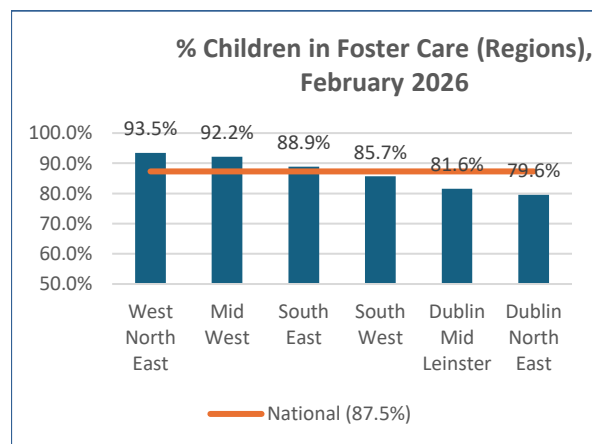

- **5,955 children in care, includes 134 unaccompanied minors.** The Service for Separated Children Seeking International Protection (SCSIP) reports an additional 425 children being accommodated / provided with services under Section 5 Child Care Act 1991.
- 3% (154) increase in children in care year on year (5,801).
- 85.6% of all children (mainstream and unaccompanied minors) in care in foster care
- 87.3% of mainstream children in care in foster care

Regional

- **West North East reports the highest number of children in care** (1,212; 20%). Dublin Mid Leinster reports the fewest number (851; 14%).
- The percentage of children in foster care across the regions ranges from 93.5% in West North East to 79.6% in Dublin North East. Three regions (West North East, Mid West and South East) report a percentage higher than the national average of 87.3%.

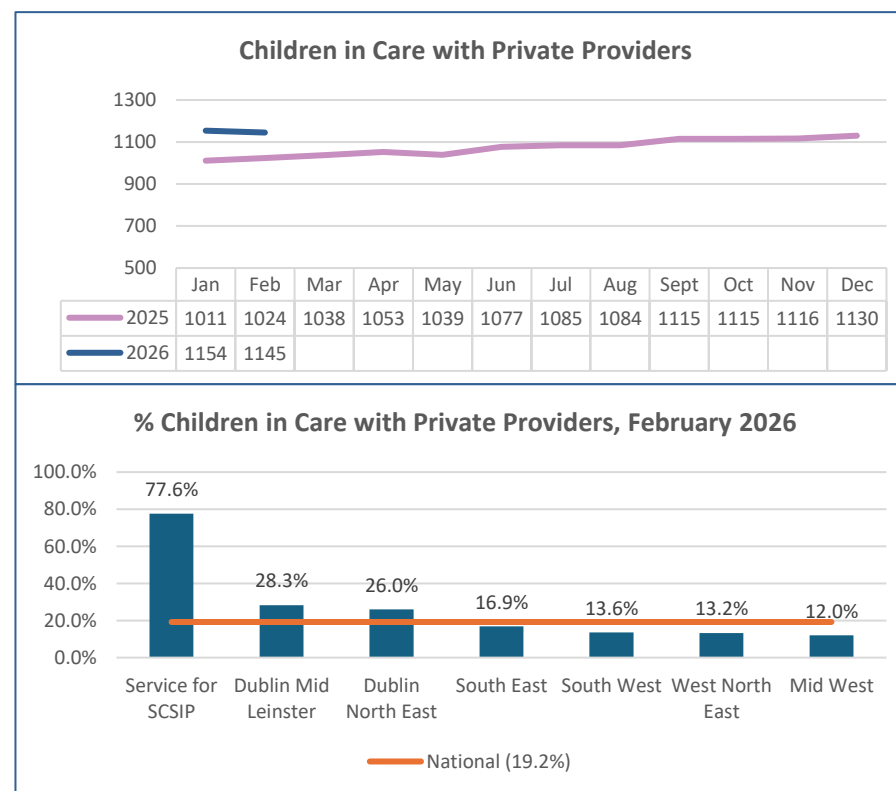
- **1,145 (19.2%)** children in care are with **private providers**
- **12% (121) increase** in the number of children with private providers year on year (1,024).
- 35% (402) of children with private providers were in residential care, 55% (632) were in foster care and 10% (111) were in other care placements.

Regional

- Dublin North East (243) and Dublin Mid Leinster (241) report the highest numbers of children with private providers. Mid West reports the fewest at 119.
- The percentage of children in care with private providers across the regions ranges from 28.3% (Dublin Mid Leinster) to 12% (Mid West) against a national average of 19.2%.

Service for Separated Children Seeking International Protection

- The majority of unaccompanied minors in care are with private providers (77.6%; 104).

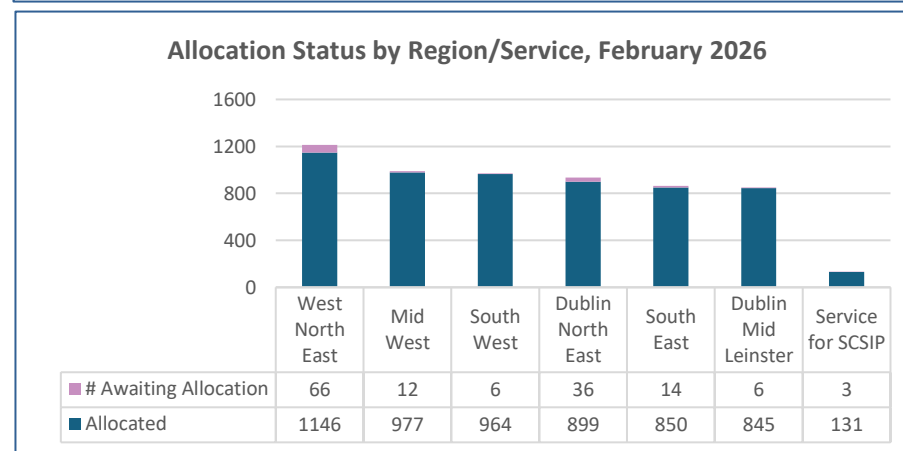
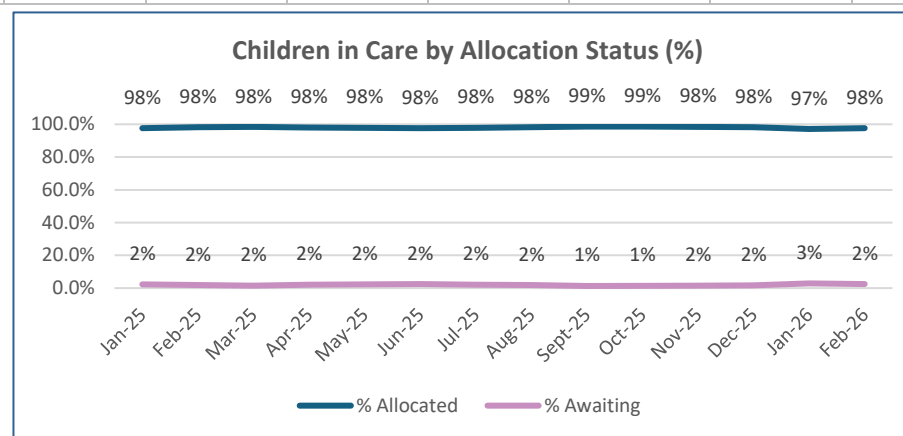

- **98% (5,812) of children in care** have an **allocated case worker**
- High rate consistently maintained
- **143 children awaiting allocation**, 27 (16%) fewer than January 2026 (170).
- 92% (5,324) of children who were allocated were allocated to a social worker; 8% (488) were allocated to another professional.
- **84% (4,994) children in care** have an **up-to-date care plan**, 961 (16%) children awaiting

Regional

- Four of the six regions reporting 98% or higher for children allocated to a case worker. Rates reported by Dublin North East (96%) and West North East (95%) lower than average.
- West North East reports the highest number of children awaiting allocation (66), followed to a lesser extent by Dublin North East (36).
- Three of the six regions reporting 84% or higher for children with an up-to-date care plan. Rates reported by Dublin Mid Leinster (81%), Dublin North East (78%) and South West (83%) lower than average.

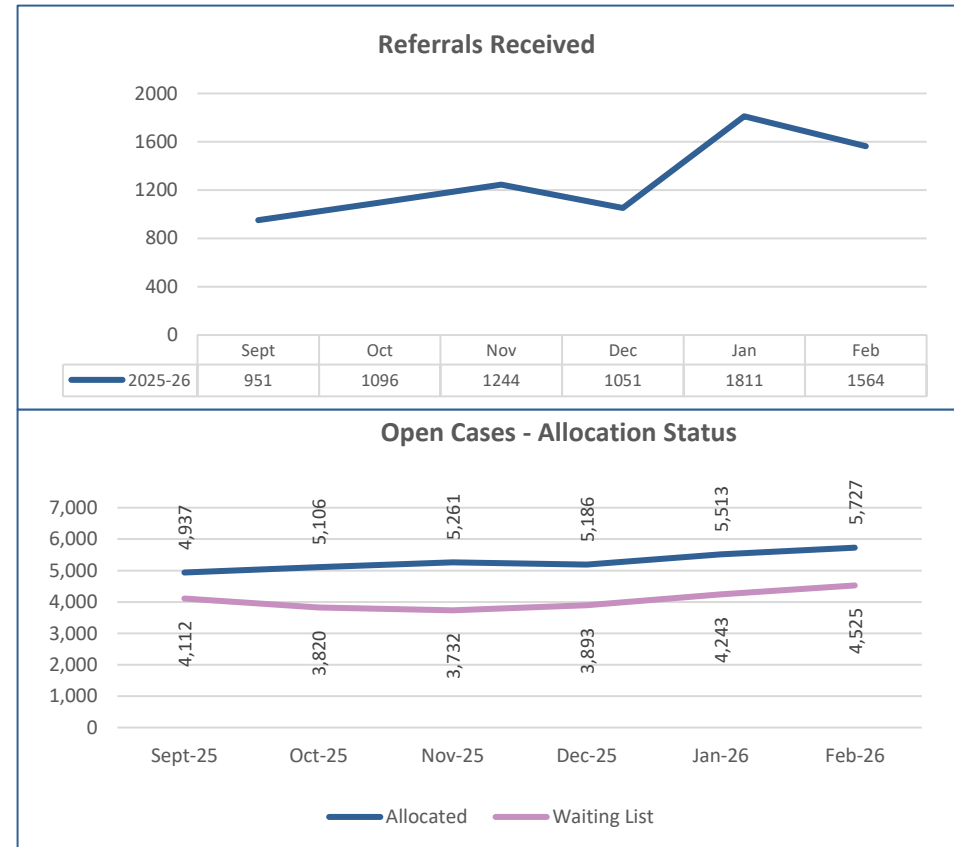

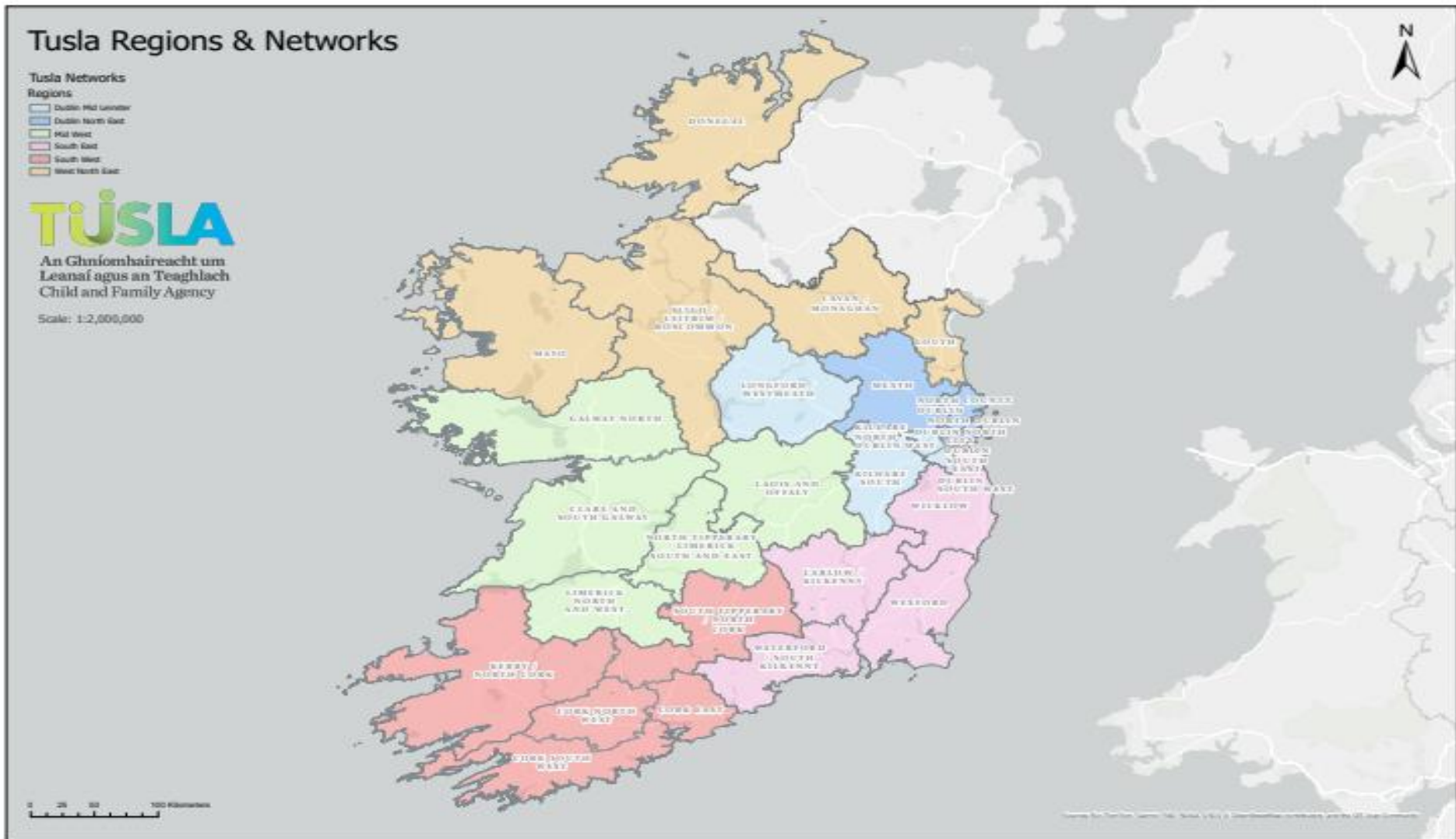

Key Messages | February 2026

- **1,564 referrals** for an education welfare service in Feb 2026, bringing to 7,717 the number of referrals for the school YTD
- **10,252 cases open** to educational welfare services at the end of Feb 2026, 496 (5%) more than Jan 2026 (9,756) and the highest number for all months this school YTD.
- **55.9% (5,727) of open cases were allocated**, down slightly from 56.5% (5,513) in Jan 2026.
- Despite the slight decrease in the percentage of cases allocated, there were 214 more cases allocated at the end of Feb 2026 (5,727) than at the end of Jan 2026 (5,513).
- This represents a 4% increase in cases allocated over the month.
- **44.1% (4,525) cases were on a waiting list for allocation**
- 282 more cases on the waiting list at the end of Feb 2026 (4,525) than at the end of Jan 2026 (4,243).
- This represents a 7% increase over the month, and it is the third consecutive monthly increase.

These children are the subject of a child protection plan agreed at a child protection conference. The CPNS is accessible to named professional groups subject to strict protocols. CASP	Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure It is Tusla's statutory obligation and responsibility to promote the welfare of children under Section 3 of the Child Care Act 1991 and under Section 8 (1)(b) of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013. In meeting this obligation and

	<p>responsibility, where there is a need to share information with a relevant third party to protect an identified, identifiable and or yet to be identified children, or yet to be identified child or children from harm, Tusla must carry out an assessment of allegations of child abuse in line with fair procedures. This is called a ‘substantiation assessment’ – an assessment that examines and weighs up all the evidence and decides if the allegation is founded or unfounded on the balance of probabilities. If the allegation is founded a determination is made whether that the person who is the subject of the abuse allegations poses a potential risk to a child or children. Tusla calls this process the CASP – Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure. Further information can be found on the Tusla website</p>
