About this Report

This report provides an overview of service activity and performance across a number of key metrics for **January 2026**.

In January 2026, Tusla commenced implementation of a major reform programme aimed at improving services delivered to children, young people and their families.

Previously, Tusla was set up to work across 17 geographical areas configured into six regions. These areas differed in size and staffing levels with the result that children, young people and families, did not always have the same level of access to services, or the same level of supports available.

To address this inequity, Tusla changed its structure to work across 30 networks in six regions. Each new network was indexed using Central Statistics Office demographic data, including population size, disadvantage and deprivation. The networks are more equal in size and staffing ensuring more equal access to services for everyone, no matter where they live.

This new configuration can be viewed on the map and table in Appendix 1 of this report.

The key metrics included in this report provide a snapshot of performance and activity across the following service areas, Safety & Welfare (previously referred to as Child Protection and Welfare), Children in Care, Tusla Education Support Services (Tess) and Children's Services Regulation (CSR). National and regional breakdowns of the data are provided in the main body of the report. Network level data can be found in Appendix 3.

Explanations of the terms and abbreviations used in this report can be found in Appendix 2.

Data can change from previously published data due to ongoing validation of data. Also, data for January 2026 should be interpreted with caution due to work underway to align cases to new regions/networks.

Key Messages

SAFETY AND WELFARE

Referrals

- 9,814 referrals in January 2026, a 14% (1,181) increase year on year (8,633).

Open Cases (Safety & Welfare and Children in Care Combined)

- 24,490 cases open to social work (includes safety & welfare cases and children in care) at the end of January 2026, a 6% (1,332) increase year on year (23,158).
- 74% (18,203) of cases allocated to a case worker. Of these, 81% were allocated to a social worker and 19% were allocated to another professional.
- 6,287 (26%) cases awaiting allocation, 889 (16%) more than December 2025 (5,398).

Open Cases (Safety & Welfare Cases Only)

- 18,679 cases open to social work (safety & welfare cases only) at the end of January 2026, a 7% (1,213) increase year on year (17,466).
- 67% (12,553) of cases allocated to a case worker. Of these, 78% were allocated to a social worker and 22% were allocated to another professional.
- 6,126 (33%) cases awaiting allocation, 807 (15%) more than December 2025 (5,319).

Child Protection Notification System (CPNS)

- 1,156 children 'active' on the CPNS at the end of January 2026, a 16% (159) increase year on year (997)
- 98.6% (1,140) of children allocated to a social worker; 16 children awaiting allocation.
- 7 of the children awaiting allocation were allocated to another professional, 11 children were subsequently allocated to a social worker.

Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure (CASP)

- 327 assessments open under CASP at the end of January 2026, a 51% (341) decrease year on year (668).
- 87% (285) of assessments allocated to a social worker, 42 (13%) assessments awaiting allocation, 19 (83%) more than December 2025 (23).

CHILDREN IN CARE

- 5,947 children in care (includes 136 unaccompanied minors) at the end of January 2026, a 3% (146) increase year on year (5,801).
- 85.7% of all children in care are in foster care; 87.5% of children in care across the regions are in foster care.

- 1,154 (19.4%) children in care are in placements with private providers, a 14% (143) increase year on year (1,011).
- 97% (5,777) of children in care allocated to a case worker. Of these 89% were allocated to social worker and 11% were allocated to another professional.
- 170 children awaiting allocation, 68 (67%) more than Dec 2025 (102).
- 85% (5,027) of children in care have an up-to-date care plan.

TUSLA EDUCATION SUPPORT SERVICES

- 6,153 referrals for an educational welfare this school year to date.
- 9,756 cases open to educational welfare services, the highest number this school year to date.
- 57% (5,513) of cases allocated to an educational welfare officers, 4,243 (43%) cases on a waiting list for allocation, 350 (9%) more than December 2025 (3,893).

CHILDREN'S SERVICES REGULATION

Early Years Services (Pre-Schools)

- 3,941 early years services (pre-schools) on the register at the end of January 2026, a 2% (95) decrease year on year (4,036).

Home Education

- 2,579 children on the register for home education at the end of January 2026, a 9% (220) increase year on year (2,359).
- 367 children awaiting assessment for registration for home education, slight increasing trend beginning to emerge.
- 37% (217) decrease in the number waiting assessment for registration year on year (584).

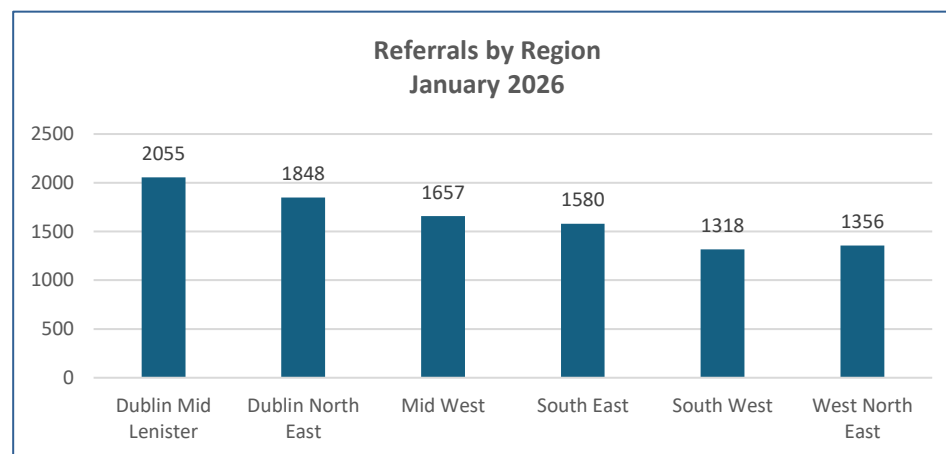
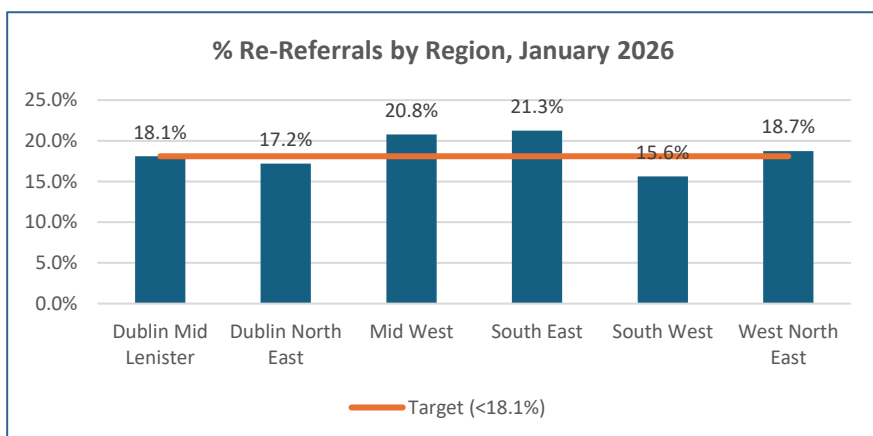
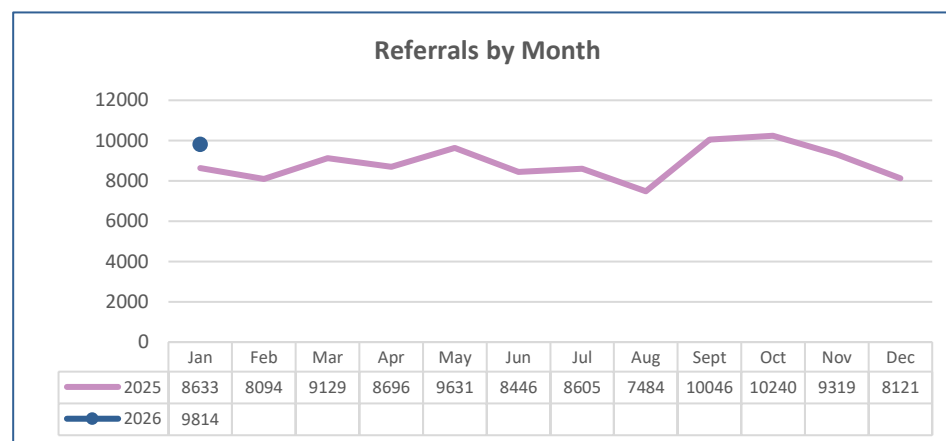

- 18.6% of referrals were re-referrals against a target of ≤18.1%

Regional

- Highest **number of referrals** reported by Dublin Mid Leinster (2,055; 21%), fewest number reported by South West (1,318; 13%).
- Highest **rate of re-referrals** reported by South East (21.3%), lowest rate reported by South West (15.6%). Three regions (Mid West, South East and West North East) slightly above the target of ≤18.1%.

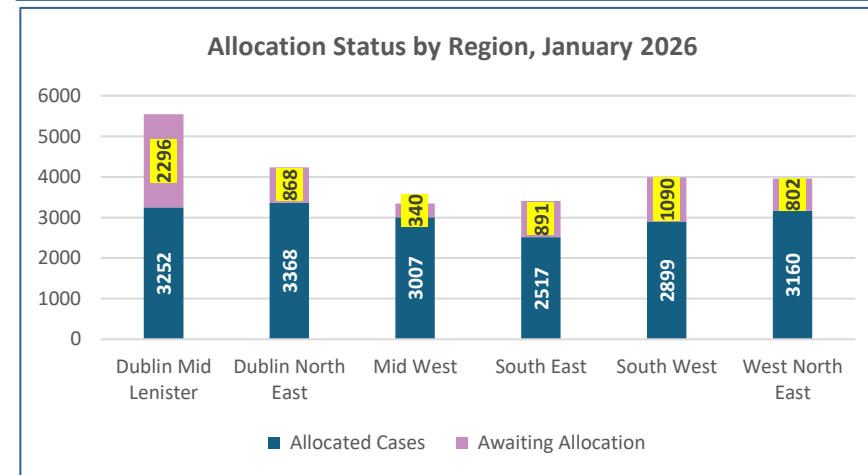
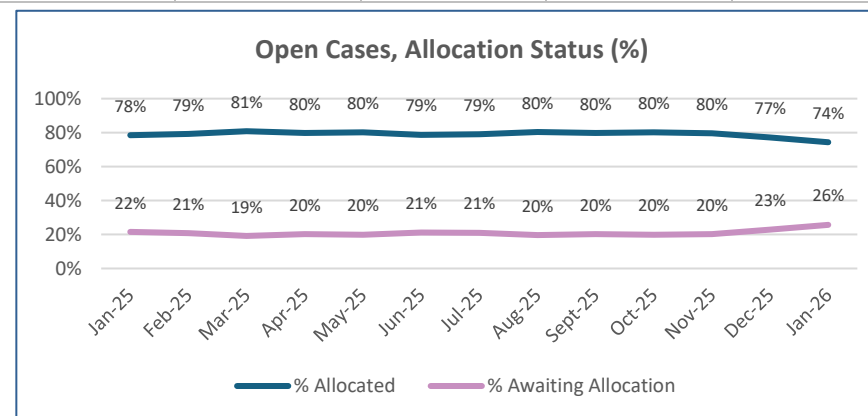
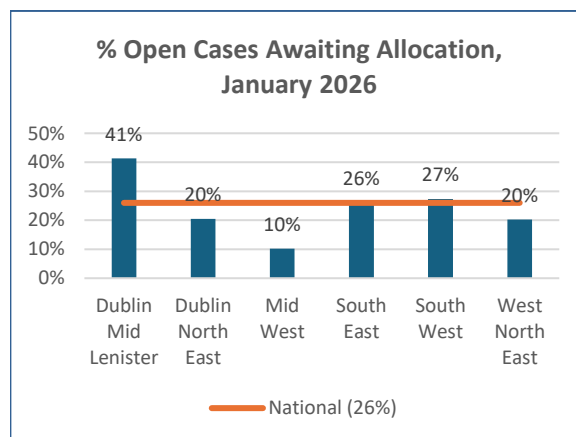

- **24,490 cases open** to social work at the end of Jan 2026; 6% (1,332) increase year on year
- **74% (18,203) of open cases allocated to a case worker**
- **6,287 (26%) cases awaiting allocation**, 889 (16%) more than Dec 2025 (5,398).
- 81% of cases allocated are allocated to a social worker; 19% allocated to another professional
- **291 (4.6%) cases awaiting allocation are high priority**, 59 (25%) more than Dec 2025 (232).

Regional

- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of open cases** (5,548; 23%). Mid West reports the fewest number (3,347; 14%).
- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of cases awaiting allocation** (2,296; 37% of all cases awaiting). Mid West reports the fewest number (340; 5%).
- Percentage of cases awaiting allocation higher than average (26%) in two regions, Dublin Mid Leinster (41%) and South West (27%).

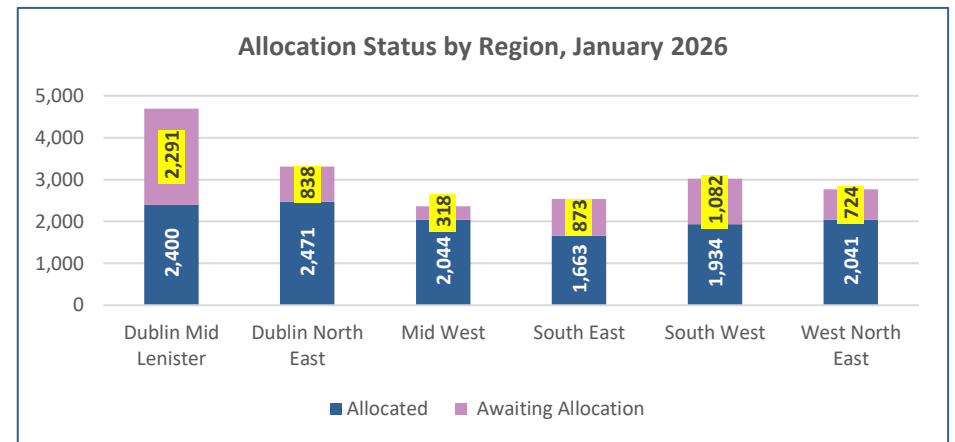
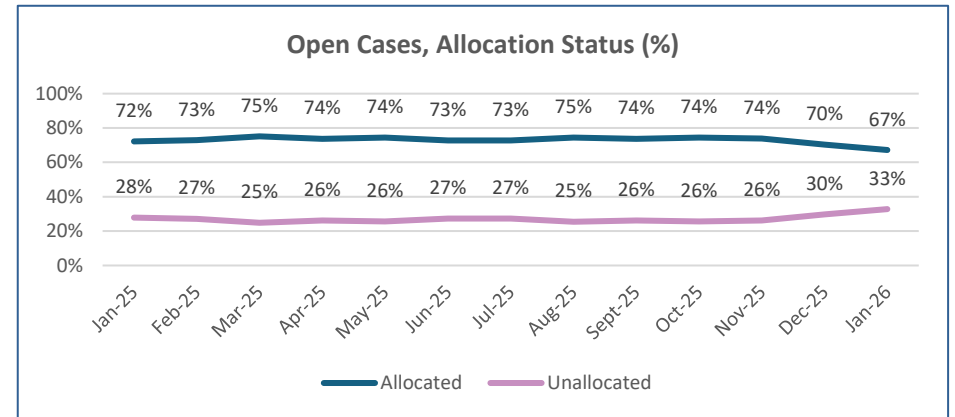
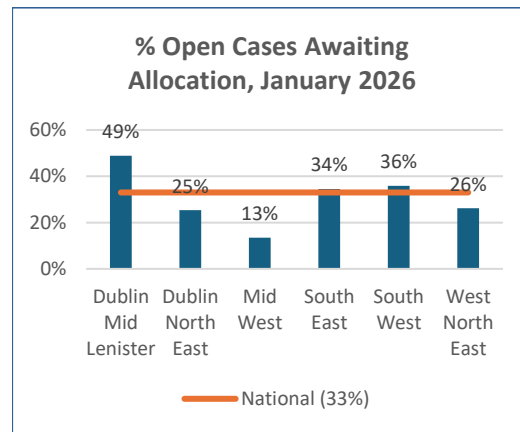

- **18,679 cases open** to social work at the end of Jan 2026; 7% (1,213) increase year on year
- **67% (12,553) of open cases allocated to a case worker**
- **6,126 (33%) cases awaiting allocation**, 807 (15%) more than Dec 2025 (5,319).
- 78% of cases allocated are allocated to a social worker; 22% allocated to another professional
- **232 (4%) cases awaiting allocation are high priority**, 25 (12%) more than Dec 2025 (207).

Regional

- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of open cases**, (4,691; 25%). Mid West reports the fewest number (2,362; 13%).
- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of cases awaiting allocation** (2,291; accounting for 37% of all cases awaiting), Mid West reports the fewest number (318; 5%).
- Percentage of cases awaiting allocation higher than average (33%) in three regions, Dublin Mid Leinster (49%), South East (34%) and South West (36%).

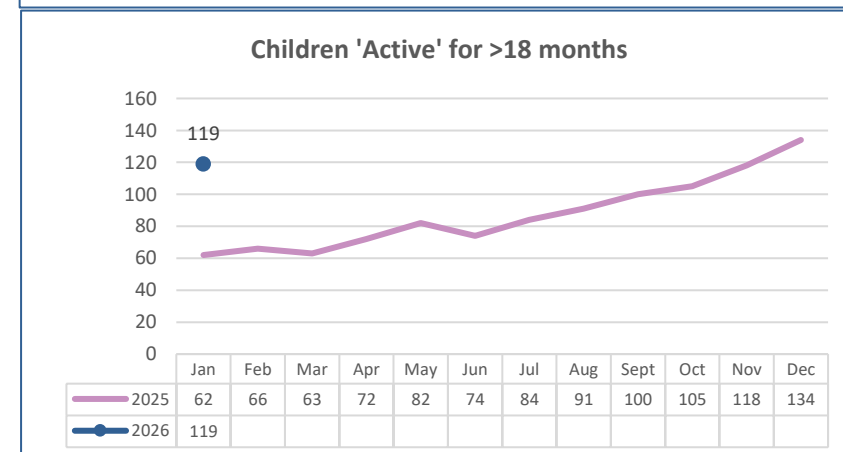
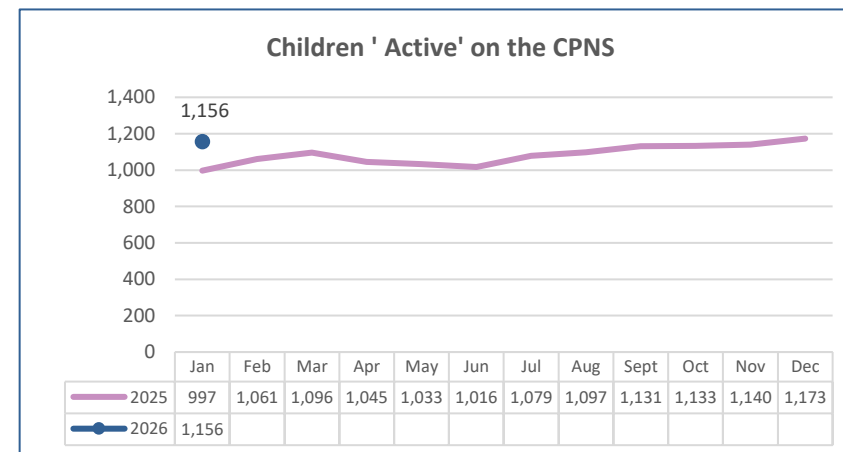
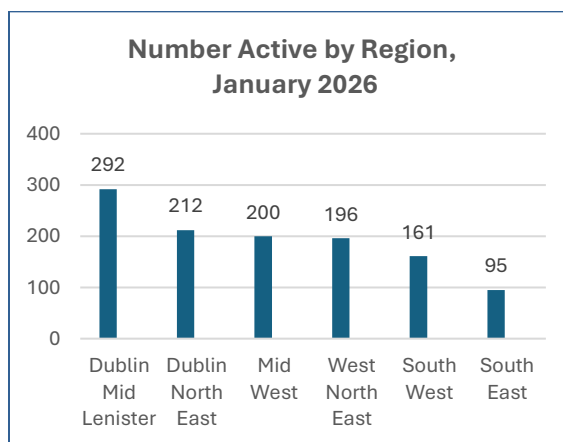

- **1,156 children 'active' on the CPNS**, 17 fewer than Dec 2025 (1,173) and the first decrease after six consecutive increases.
- 16% (159) increase in the number of children 'active' year on year (997)
- **98.6% (1,140) of children allocated to a social worker**; 16 children awaiting allocation
- 7 of the children awaiting allocation were allocated to another professional, 11 children were subsequently allocated to a social worker.
- **119 (10%) children 'active' for more than 18 months**, slight decrease (15) from Dec 2025 (134; 11%) but 57 (92%) more than Jan 2025 (62).

Regional

- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number (292, 25%) of children 'active'**. South East reports the fewest number (95; 8%).
- All but one of the 16 children awaiting allocation to a social worker were reported by Dublin Mid Leinster.
- **Dublin Mid Leinster reports the highest number of children 'active' for >18 months (36)**. South East reports the fewest number (4).

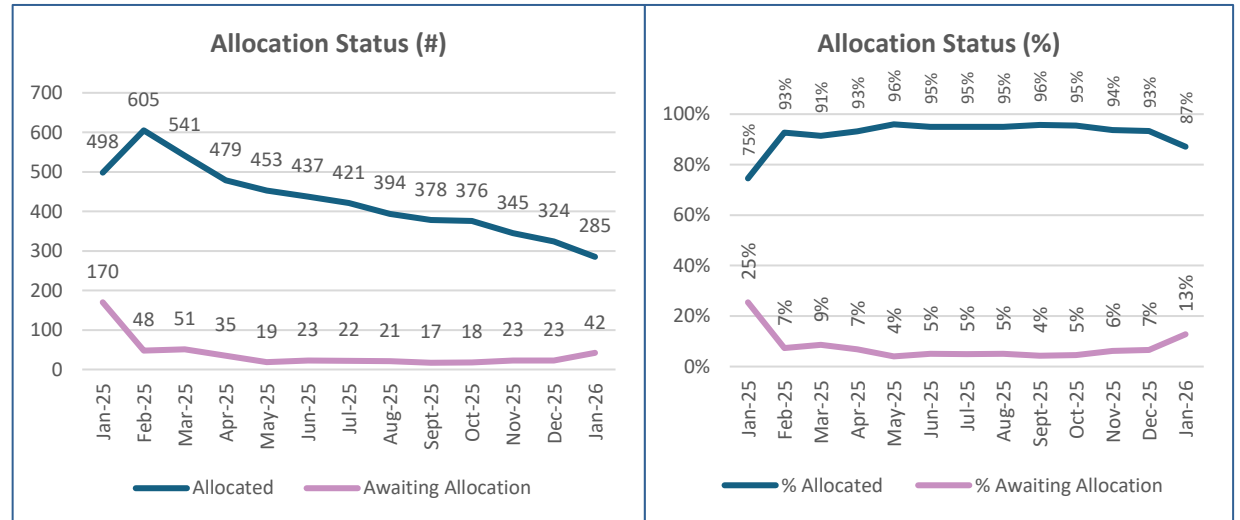

Regional

- West North East reports the highest number (114; 35%) of open assessments. Dublin North East reports the fewest number (24; 7%).
- Dublin North East (14) and West North East (14) account for 67% of assessments awaiting allocation. South West reports no assessments awaiting allocation.

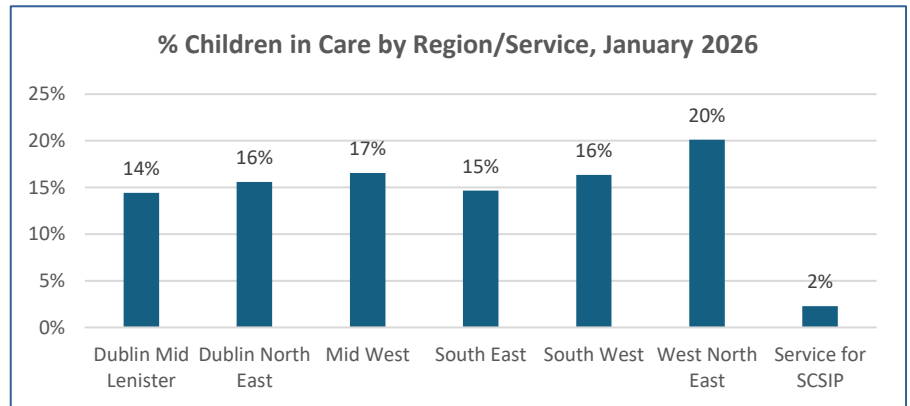
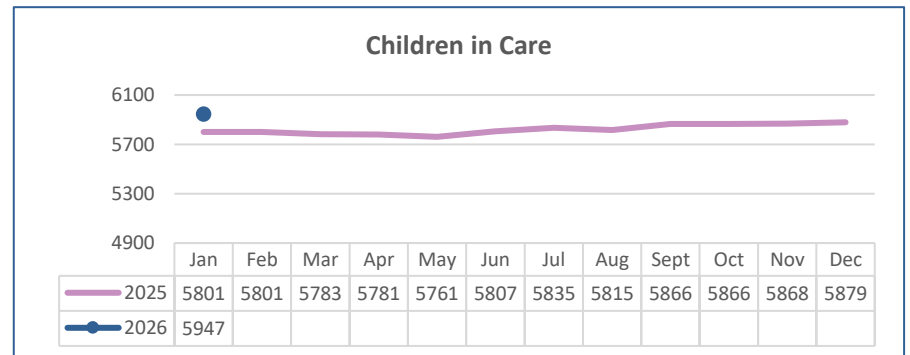
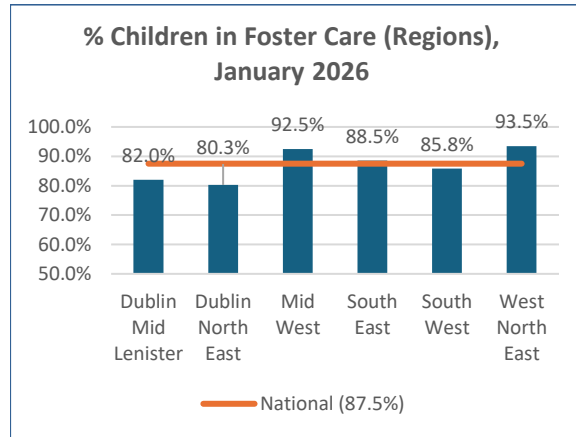

- 85.7% of all children in care in foster care; 87.5% for regions/networks only

Regional

- **West North East reports the highest number of children in care** (1,197; 20%). Dublin Mid Leinster reports the fewest number (857; 14%).
- The percentage of children in foster care across the regions ranges from 93.5% in West North East to 80.3% in Dublin North East. Three regions (Mid West, South East and West North East) report a percentage higher than the national average of 87.5%.

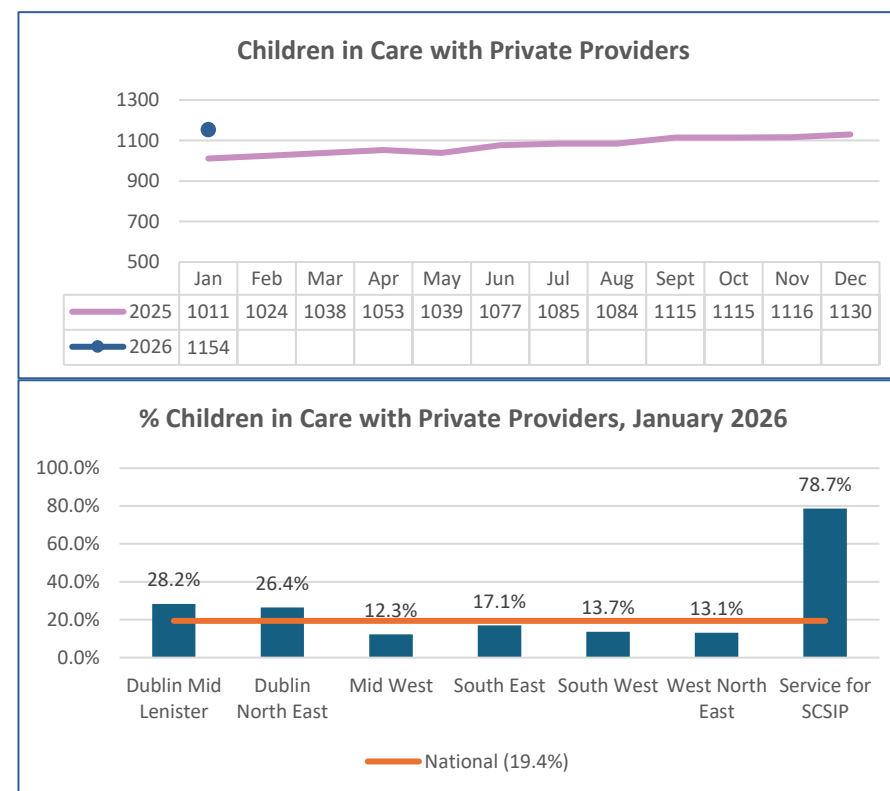

- 35% (409) of children with private providers were in residential care, 55% (635) were in foster care and 10% (110) were in other care placements.

Regional

- Dublin North East (245) and Dublin Mid Leinster (242) report the highest numbers of children with private providers. Mid West reports the fewest number at 121.
- The percentage of children in care with private providers across the regions ranges from 28% (Dublin Mid Leinster) to 12% (Mid West) against a national average of 19%.

Service for Separated Children Seeking International Protection

- The majority of unaccompanied minors in care are with private providers (78.7%; 107).

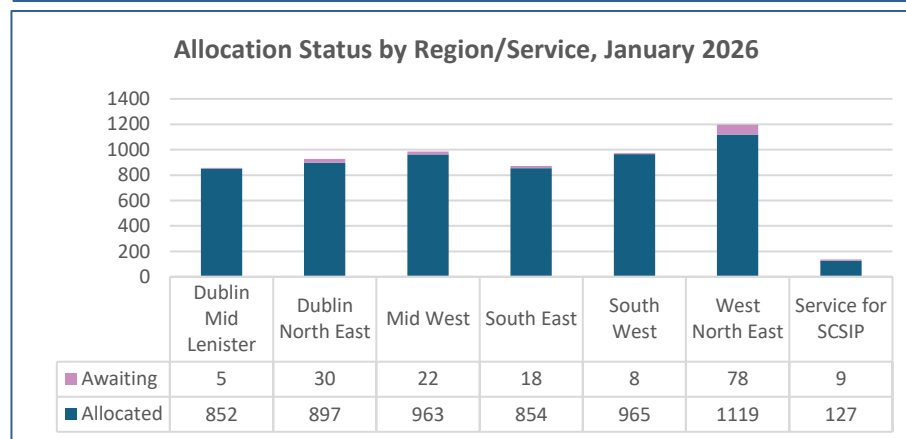
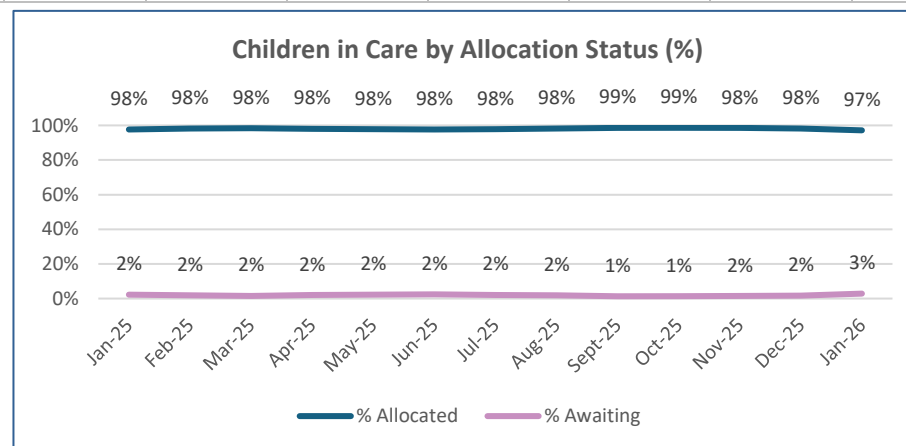

- 89% (5,154) of children who were allocated were allocated to a social worker; 11% (623) were allocated to another professional.
- **85% (5,027) children in care** have an **up-to-date care plan**, 920 (15%) children awaiting

Regional

- Five of the six regions reporting 97% or higher for children allocated to a case worker. Rate reported by West North East (93%) lower than average.
- West North East reports the highest number of children awaiting allocation (78), followed to a lesser extent by Dublin North East (30) and Mid West (22).
- Four of the six regions reporting 85% or higher for children with an up-to-date care plan. Rates reported by Dublin Mid Leinster (83%) and Dublin North East (78%) lower than average.

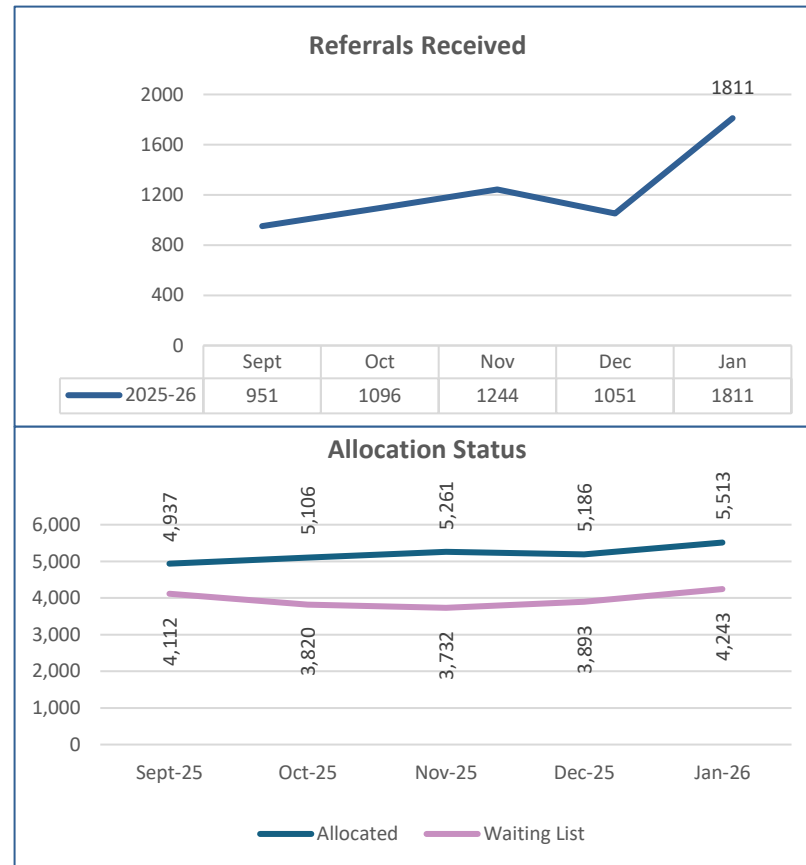

- **1,811 referrals** for an education welfare service in Jan 2026, the highest number this school YTD.
- **9,756 cases open** to educational welfare services at the end of Jan 2026, 677 (7%) more than Dec 2025 (9,079) and the highest number this school YTD.
- **56.5% (5,513) of open cases were allocated**, down slightly from 57.1% (5,186) in Dec 2025.
- Despite the slight decrease in the percentage of cases allocated, there were 327 more cases allocated at the end of Jan 2026 (5,513) than at the end of Dec 2025 (5,186).
- This represents a 6% increase in cases allocated over the month.
- **43.5% (4,243) cases were on a waiting list for allocation**
- 350 more cases on the waiting list at the end of Jan 2026 (4,243) than at the end of Dec 2025 (3,893).
- This represents a 9% increase over the month, and it is the second consecutive monthly increase.

These children are the subject of a child protection plan agreed at a child protection conference. The CPNS is accessible to named professional groups subject to strict protocols. CASP	Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure It is Tusla's statutory obligation and responsibility to promote the welfare of children under Section 3 of the Child Care Act 1991 and under Section 8 (1)(b) of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013. In meeting this obligation and

	<p>responsibility, where there is a need to share information with a relevant third party to protect an identified, identifiable and or yet to be identified children, or yet to be identified child or children from harm, Tusla must carry out an assessment of allegations of child abuse in line with fair procedures. This is called a ‘substantiation assessment’ – an assessment that examines and weighs up all the evidence and decides if the allegation is founded or unfounded on the balance of probabilities. If the allegation is founded a determination is made whether that the person who is the subject of the abuse allegations poses a potential risk to a child or children. Tusla calls this process the CASP – Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure. Further information can be found on the Tusla website</p>
