About this Report

This report provides an overview of service activity and performance across a number of key metrics for **March 2026**.

In January 2026, Tusla commenced implementation of a major reform programme aimed at improving services delivered to children, young people and their families.

Previously, Tusla was set up to work across 17 geographical areas configured into six regions. These areas differed in size and staffing levels with the result that children, young people and families, did not always have the same level of access to services, or the same level of supports available.

To address this inequity, Tusla changed its structure to work across 30 networks in six regions. Each new network was indexed using Central Statistics Office demographic data, including population size, disadvantage and deprivation. The networks are more equal in size and staffing ensuring more equal access to services for everyone, no matter where they live.

This new configuration can be viewed on the map and table in Appendix 1 of this report.

The key metrics included in this report provide a snapshot of performance and activity across the following service areas, Safety & Welfare (previously referred to as Child Protection and Welfare), Children in Care, Tusla Education Support Services (Tess) and Children's Services Regulation (CSR). National and regional breakdowns of the data are provided in the main body of the report. Network level data can be found in Appendix 3.

Explanations of the terms and abbreviations used in this report can be found in Appendix 2.

Data can change from previously published data due to ongoing validation of data. Also, data for 2026 should be interpreted with caution due to work underway to align cases to new regions/networks.

Key Messages

SAFETY AND WELFARE

Referrals

- 9,841 referrals in March 2026, bringing to 28,800 the number of referrals for the first three months of 2026.
- 11% (2,944) increase in referrals, 2026 YTD versus the same period in 2025 (25,856).

Open Cases (Safety & Welfare and Children in Care Combined)

- 25,178 cases open to social work (includes safety & welfare cases and children in care) at the end of March 2026; an 8% (1,922) increase year on year (23,256).
- 78% (19,729) of cases allocated to a case worker. Of these 78% were allocated to a social worker and 22% were allocated to another professional.
- 5,449 (22%) cases awaiting allocation, 210 (4%) fewer than February 2026 (5,659).

Open Cases (Safety & Welfare Cases Only)

- 19,356 cases open to social work (safety & welfare cases only) at the end of March 2026; a 10% (1,779) increase year on year (17,577).
- 72% (14,029) of cases allocated to a case worker. Of these 73% were allocated to a social worker and 27% were allocated to another professional.
- 5,327 (28%) cases awaiting allocation, 192 (3%) fewer than February 2026 (5,519).

Child Protection Notification System (CPNS)

- 1,169 children 'active' on the CPNS at the end of March 2026, an 7% (73) increase year on year (1,096).
- 98.3% (1,149) of children allocated to a social worker; 20 children awaiting allocation, 12 more than February 2026 (8). Thirteen of the 20 children were allocated to another professional worker.

Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure (CASP)

- 312 assessments open under CASP at the end of March 2026, a 47% (280) decrease year on year (592).
- 89% (277) of assessments allocated to a social worker, 35 (11%) assessments awaiting allocation, 6 (15%) fewer than February 2026 (41).

CHILDREN IN CARE

- 5,952 children in care (includes 130 unaccompanied minors) at the end of March 2026, a 3% (169) increase year on year (5,783).

- 85.3% of all children in care (mainstream and unaccompanied minors) are in foster care; 87.0% of mainstream children in care in foster care.
- 1,155 (19.4%) children in care are in placements with private providers, a 11% (117) increase year on year (1,038).
- 98% (5,820) of children in care allocated to a case worker. Of these 92% (5,339) were allocated to social workers and 8% (481) were allocated to other professionals.
- 132 children awaiting allocation, 11 (8%) fewer than February 2026 (143).
- 82% (4,908) of children in care have an up-to-date care plan.

TUSLA EDUCATION SUPPORT SERVICES

- 9,529 referrals for an educational welfare this school year to date.
- 10,924 cases open to educational welfare services, the highest number this school year to date.
- 55% (5,972) of cases allocated to an educational welfare officers, 4,952 (45%) cases on a waiting list for allocation, 427 (9%) more than February 2026 (4,525).

CHILDREN'S SERVICES REGULATION

Early Years Services (Pre-Schools)

- 3,941 early years services (pre-schools) on the register at the end of March 2026, a 1% (34) decrease year on year (3,975).
- 9% (57) increase in inspections of pre-school services year on year (669 v 612).

Home Education

- 2,637 children on the register for home education at the end of March 2026, a 6% (138) increase year on year (2,596).
- 366 children awaiting assessment for registration for home education, 18 (5%) more than February 2026 (348).
- 22% (104) decrease in the number waiting year on year (470).

- **25,178 cases open** to social work at the end of March 2026; 8% (1,922) increase year on year
- **78% (19,729) of open cases allocated to a case worker**
- **5,449 (22%) cases awaiting allocation**, 210 (4%) fewer than Feb 2026 (5,659).
- 78% of cases allocated are allocated to a social worker; 22% allocated to another professional
- **296 (5%) cases awaiting allocation are high priority**, 41 (16%) more than Feb 2026 (255).

Regional

- **Dublin Mid Leinster - highest number of open cases**, (5,669; 23%).
- **Mid West - fewest number** (3,307; 13%).
- **Dublin Mid Leinster - highest number of cases awaiting allocation** (2,035; accounting for 36% of open cases in the region)

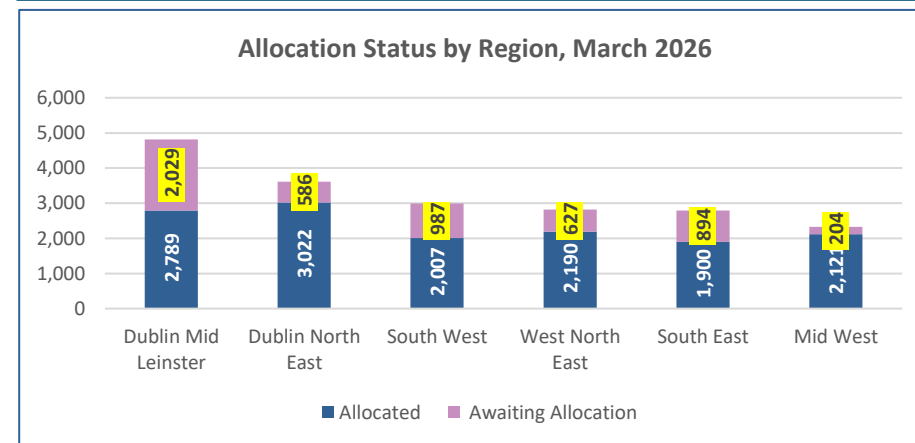
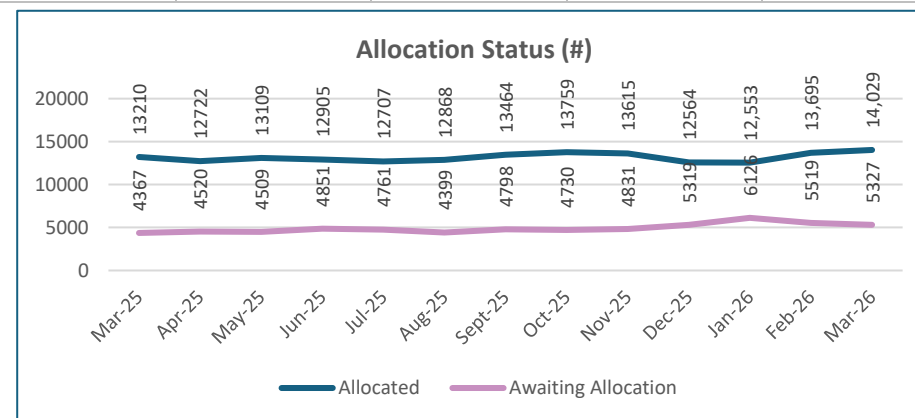
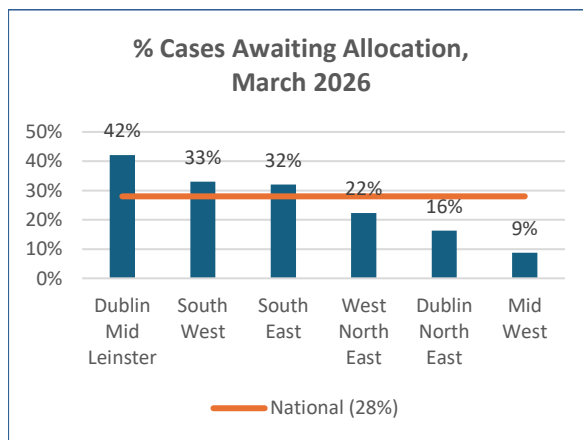

- **19,356 cases open** to social work at the end of Mar 2026, a 10% (1,779) increase year on year
- **72% (14,029) of open cases allocated to a case worker**
- **5,327 (28%) cases awaiting allocation**, 192 (3%) fewer than Feb 2026 (5,519).
- 73% of cases allocated are allocated to a social worker; 27% allocated to another professional
- **5% (258) of cases awaiting allocation are high priority**, 60 (30%) more than Feb 2026 (198).

Regional

- **Dublin Mid Leinster - highest number open cases**, (4,818; 25%).
- **Mid West - fewest number** (2,325; 12%).

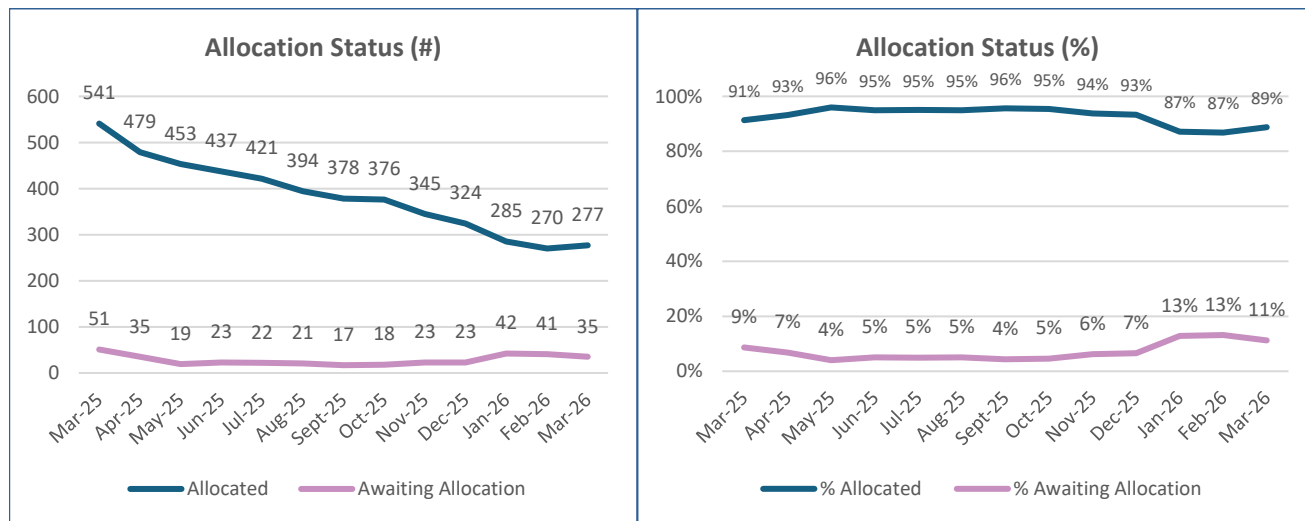

- **35 (11%) assessments awaiting allocation**, 6 (15%) fewer than Feb 2026 (41).

Regional

- **West North East - highest number** (113; 36%) of open assessments. **Dublin Mid Leinster - fewest number** (21; 7%).
- West North East (13) and Dublin North East (12) account for 71% (25) of assessments awaiting allocation. South West reports no assessments awaiting allocation.

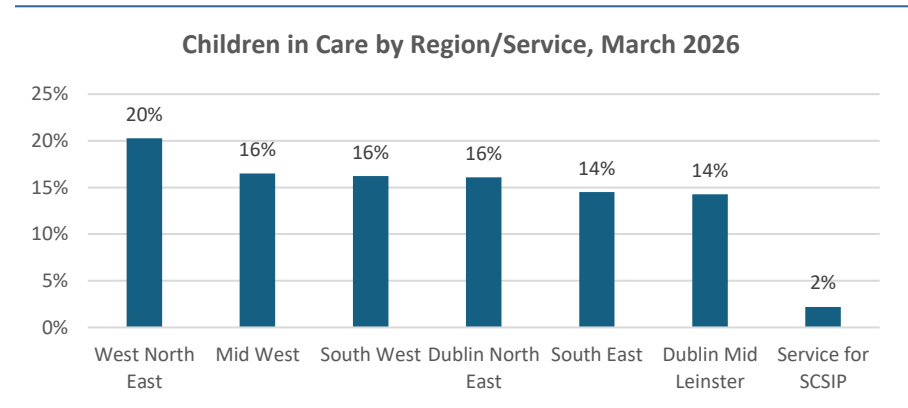
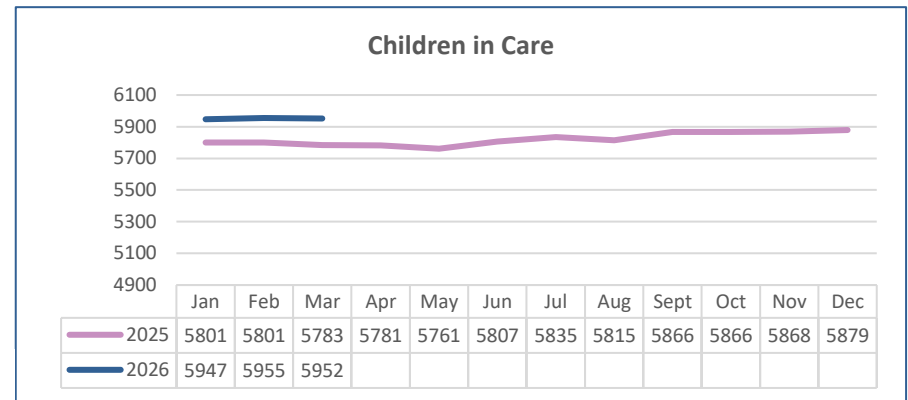
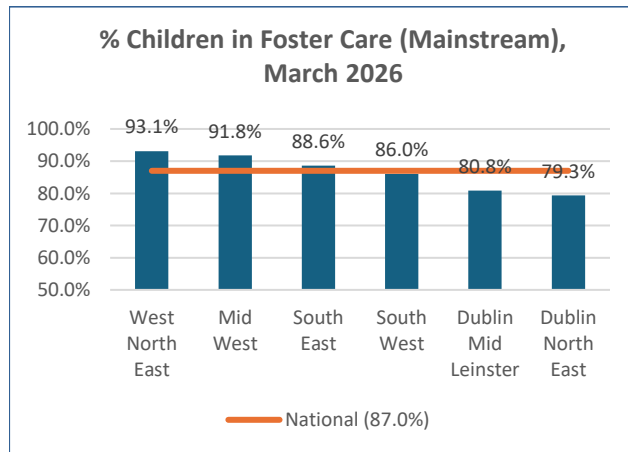

- 3% (169) increase in children in care year on year (5,783).
- 85.3% of all children (mainstream and unaccompanied minors) in care in foster care
- 87.0% of mainstream children in care in foster care

Regional

- **West North East - highest number of children in care (1,206; 20%). Dublin Mid Leinster - fewest number (849; 14%).**
- The **percentage of children in foster care** across the regions ranges from 93.1% in West North East to 79.3% in Dublin North East.

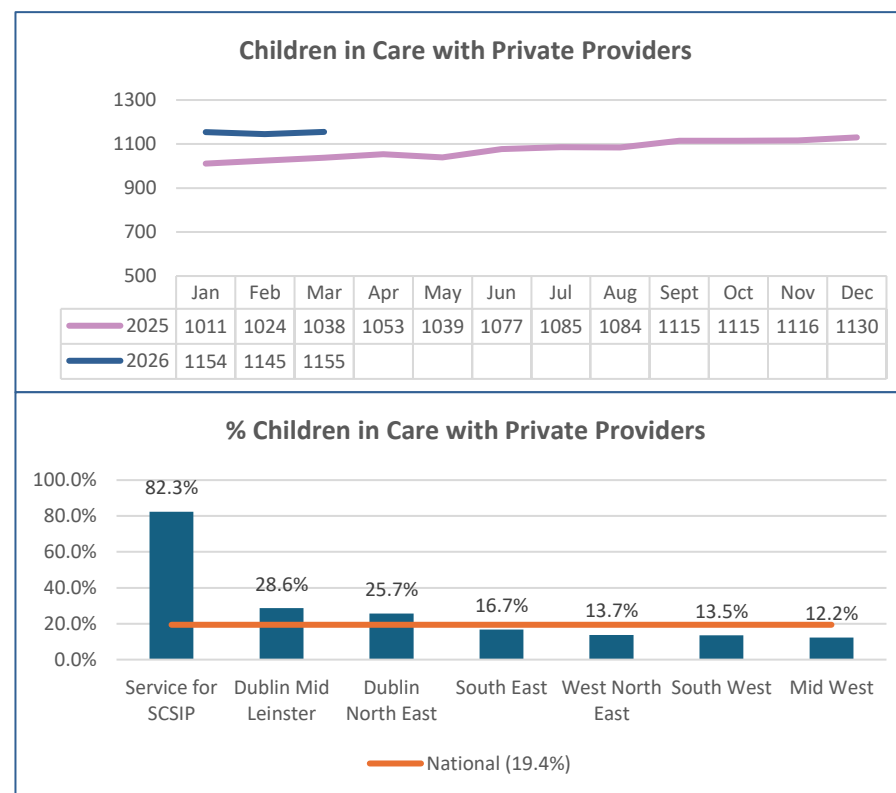
- **1,155 (19.4%)** children in care are with **private providers**
- **11% (117) increase** in the number of children with private providers year on year (1,038).
- 35% (410) of children with private providers were in residential care, 55% (632) were in foster care and 10% (113) were in other care placements.

Regional

- Dublin North East (246) and Dublin Mid Leinster (243) - highest numbers of children with private providers. Mid West reports the fewest at 120.
- The percentage of children in care with private providers across the regions ranges from 28.6% (Dublin Mid Leinster) to 12.2% (Mid West) against a national average of 19.4%.

Service for Separated Children Seeking International Protection

- The majority of unaccompanied minors in care are with private providers (82.3%; 107).

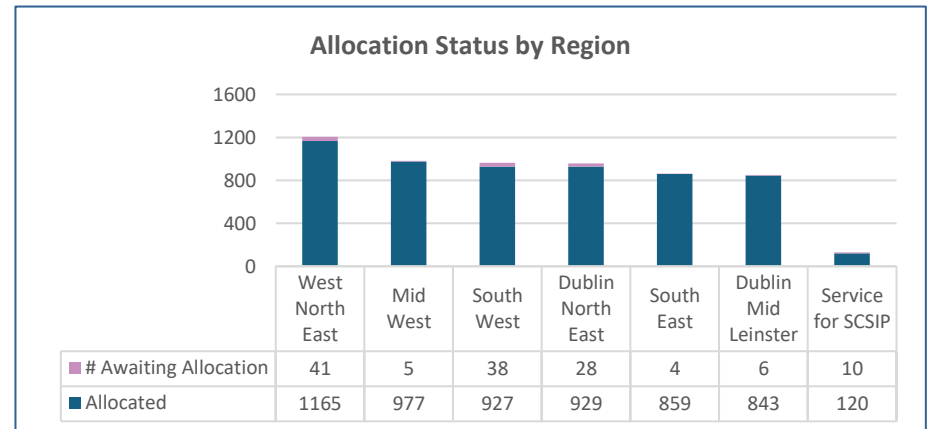
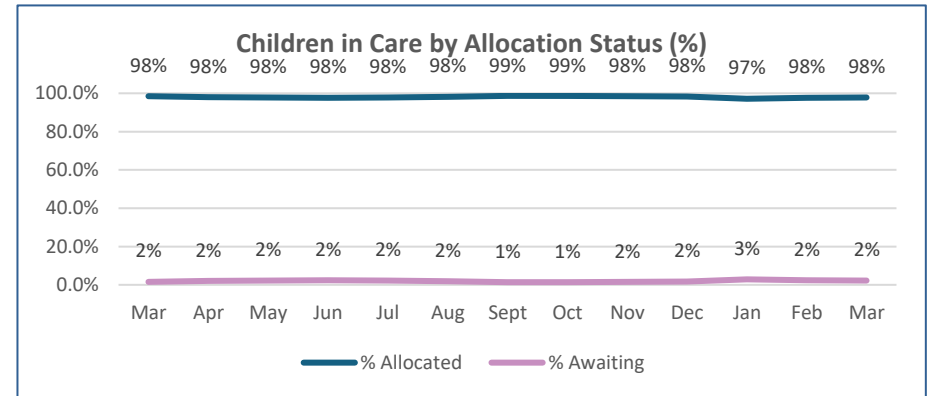

- **98% (5,820) of children in care** have an **allocated case worker**
- High rate consistently maintained
- **132 children awaiting allocation**, 11 (8%) fewer than Feb 2026 (143).
- 92% (5,339) of children who were allocated were allocated to a social worker; 8% (481) were allocated to another professional.
- **82% (4,908) children in care** have an **up-to-date care plan**, 1,044 (18%) children awaiting

Regional

- All six regions reporting **at least 96% of children with an allocated worker**.
- West North East (41) and South West (38) account for 60% (79) of children awaiting allocation to worker.
- Three of the six regions report at least 82% of children with an up-to-date care plan. Rates reported by Dublin Mid Leinster (79%), Dublin North East (77%) and South West (80%) slightly lower than average.

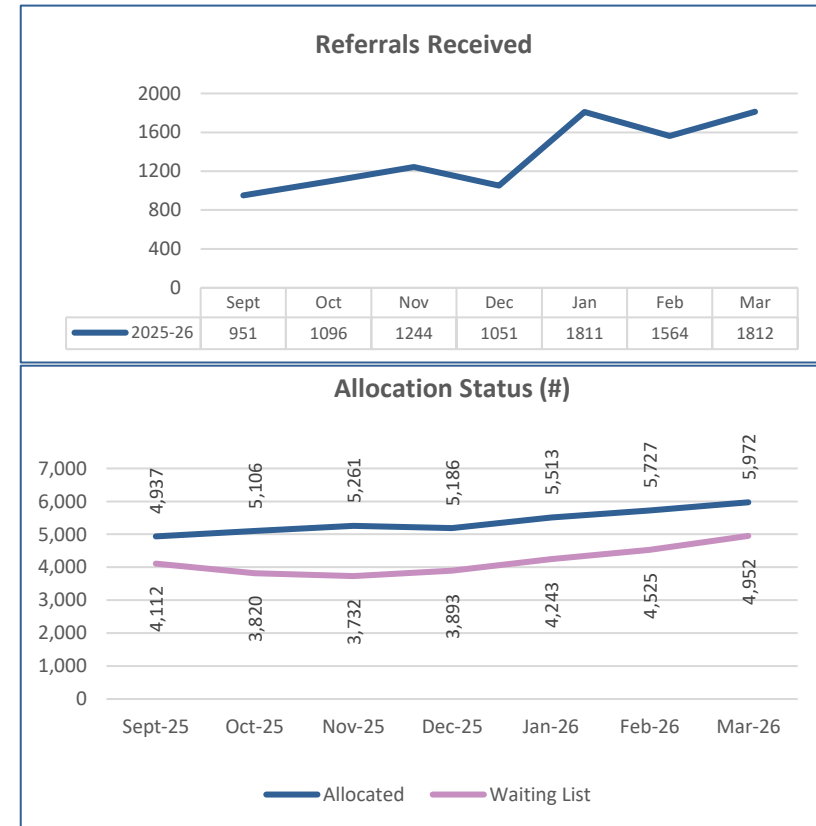

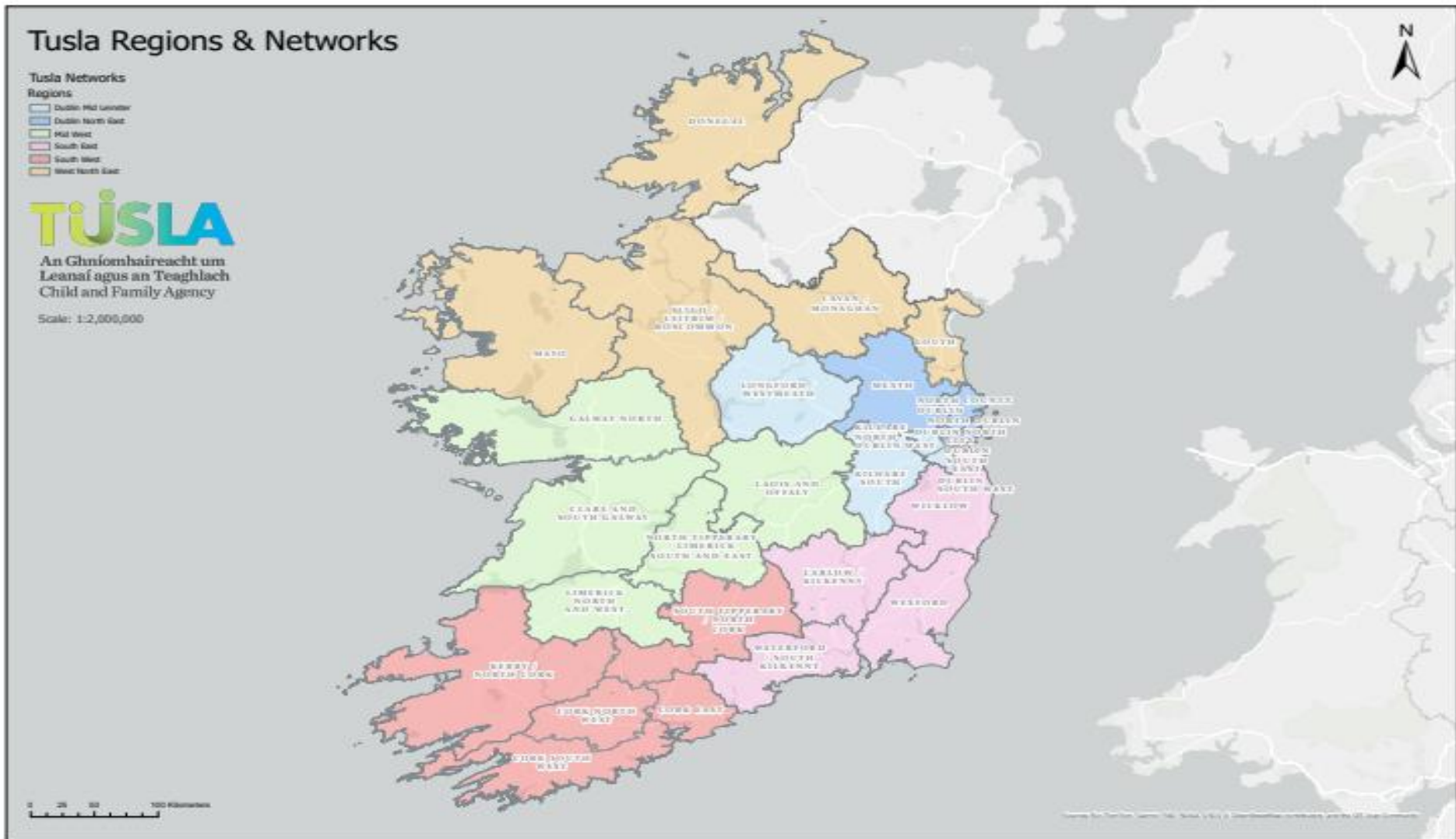

Key Messages | March 2026

- **1,812 referrals** for an education welfare service in March 2026, bringing to 9,529 the number of referrals for the school YTD
- **10,924 cases open** to educational welfare services at the end of Mar 2026, 672 (7%) more than Feb 2026 (10,252) and the highest number for all months this school YTD.
- **54.7% (5,972) of open cases were allocated**, down slightly from 55.9% (5,727) in February 2026.
- Despite the slight decrease in the percentage of cases allocated, there were 245 more cases allocated at the end of Mar 2026 (5,972) than at the end of Feb 2026 (5,727).
- This represents a 4% increase in cases allocated over the month.
- **45.3% (4,952) cases were on a waiting list for allocation**
- 427 more cases on the waiting list at the end of Mar 2026 (4,952) than at the end of Feb 2026 (4,525).
- This represents a 9% increase over the month, and it is the fourth consecutive monthly increase.

CASP	Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure It is Tusla's statutory obligation and responsibility to promote the welfare of children under Section 3 of the Child Care Act 1991 and under Section 8 (1)(b) of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013. In meeting this obligation and

	<p>responsibility, where there is a need to share information with a relevant third party to protect an identified, identifiable and or yet to be identified children, or yet to be identified child or children from harm, Tusla must carry out an assessment of allegations of child abuse in line with fair procedures. This is called a ‘substantiation assessment’ – an assessment that examines and weighs up all the evidence and decides if the allegation is founded or unfounded on the balance of probabilities. If the allegation is founded a determination is made whether that the person who is the subject of the abuse allegations poses a potential risk to a child or children. Tusla calls this process the CASP – Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure. Further information can be found on the Tusla website</p>
